The many period products that were donated around the time of International Day have now been delivered to the 4 areas covered by South Yorkshire Federation. Thanks to Jenny Garside, President of Penistone WI for taking them to the Women's Refuge in Barnsley and Roberta Eales, Vice Chair of Trustees for dropping them off at Hopian (formerly Rotherham Rise). The remainder were divided between IDAS (Independent Domestic Abuse Services) in Sheffield and Phoenix Women's Aid, Doncaster. Supporting women's support organisations obviously strikes a chord with members, and it is not unusual for individuals and/or their WIs to support them throughout the year. A suggestion received from Jenny is for members to look out for two for one offers and coupons in

publications you buy or that drop through your door in order to make your contributions go

Aligned with the above is the fact that 25 November marks the start of the 16 Days of Action (ending 10th December) which links with the WI's No more Violence Against Women Campaign. Supporting local women's refuges, asking members to wear something orange – the signature colour of the United Nations' End Violence Against Women Campaign – and holding candlelit vigils have all been mentioned on My WI, as has the NFWI Wales's initiative to encourage local male groups to pledge their support to never use, excuse or remain silent about men's violence against women. The pledge and wearing a white ribbon show that men are joining us in sending out the message that domestic abuse is never acceptable, should never be ignored and must never be excused.
