F. Local CTA Dues

As per our constitution, I may recommend that the Executive Board approve a local membership fee increase. After a thorough review of our finances by our treasurer, I believe this will not be necessary for next year. As a result, our local dues shall remain the same for next year.

G. Sellback of Health Insurance

If you have elected to “sell-back” your health insurance, you should have received your second half payment as part of your June 5th paycheck. Please keep in mind that even if you “sell-back” your medical insurance you are still entitled to family dental insurance.

H. Eyeglass Reimbursement

We are in year two of a new two-year cycle for eyeglasses/contacts purchases. Members have \$400 to spend on glasses/contacts. On the form you will attest that the glasses are for your personal use. Completed claim forms with receipts attached must be sent to the HR department. There will be a two-week grace period for members to obtain glasses during this cycle because of the phased opening of our economy. [Form Link](#)

I. Study Money

J. Pay Options

Each year you have three pay options:

21 equal bi-weekly payments (September through June)

25 payments; 21 payments (September through June) + 4 payments on the last day of school

26 payments; you will receive 1/26 of your annual salary every two weeks from the first pay date in September through the last pay date in June when you will receive the remaining paychecks as separate checks, all dated June 30, which you may deposit at any time from June to August. Direct deposit will not be available for the last six paychecks.

All deductions will be spread out over the 26 pay checks.

To elect an option other than the one you currently have; you must enroll prior to June 30 and the new option may not be changed until the start of the following school year. The form is available online at: [Pay Options](#)

K. Packing and Unpacking

If you are directed to pack up your room in anticipation of construction, summer school or summer camp you are entitled to be compensated for your efforts. The rate is \$25.65 per hour. However, your claim cannot exceed \$100. The work must be done outside of the school day and a record kept of the dates and times you worked.

M. Annual Turn-In of Sick Days

If you have accumulated at least 75 sick days and wish to exercise your option of selling back unused sick days earned this year (up to 12 or 14 if you worked at Summer School) you must submit a “Request for Payment in Exchange For Accumulated Unused Sick Days” [form](#) to Dr. Natali’s office. The rate is \$95.40 per day. Please be aware that you can accumulate up to 200 days in your sick day bank. Any days in excess of 200 should be sold back to the district or donated to the Sick Bank.

For social media, we have a post that also utilizes the postcard design. This was shared on our LBCTA FB page and shared by many of our members. Please feel free to continue to share this post!



1. The Governor announced today that APPR composite scores are waived for this year. We do not know yet how it will impact tenure for teachers in years 1, 2, or 3.
2. This means that we will not be receiving any annual evaluations. We will keep you posted as things become more clear.

C. Health & Safety Committee/District Safety Team

1. We had a meeting on May 14th, where we began to discuss reopening procedures and guidelines. There was a lengthy discussion about the many variables that will come into play in attempting to reopen our schools.
2. Much of the discussion focused around masks, tests, cleaning procedures and potential barriers. What should or should not be required by both students and staff.
