

Along with a number of other German immigrants who had heard of the opportunities in grape culture on Kelleys Island, he moved here c.1865. He purchased a farm and built this modest home. 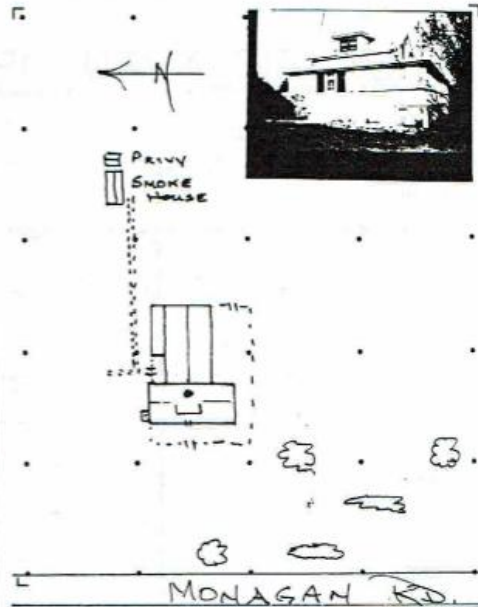

Windows in this section are 6/6 and there is a square vent in the gable end. The enclosed porch has tongue and groove siding, exposed rafters, and awning type shutters.

in 1871 and his wife later married William Schlesselman, a German farmer who had come to the island in 1860, and was working as a farm hand for Jesse Woodford (ERI-1751). The couple continued to live in the Rohr house where they farmed and worked their vineyards for almost 40 years.
