Tigers dump Abilene, 26-0

By TIM HOSTETTER Sports Writer CLAY CENTER — Clay Center head football coach Larry Wiemers was happy with a dry field and the way his team played on it Friday in defeating Abilene, 26-0.

Despite two shutout victories to start the season, Wiemers said he still couldn't truly evaluate his team because those two wins were played under wet conditions.

Friday, weather conditions were perfect and the Tigers' play wasn't far off that, at least in the eyes of the Cowboys.

Running back Ronnie Wright scored two first-quarter touchdowns and quarterback David Wiemers threw two TD passes to split end Clifford Williams to give Clay Center more than enough offense in this week's Salina Journal Area Game of the Week.

"It's a nice win for us," said coach Wiemers. "I felt like we were more solid in all areas. Like I said before, we just didn't know what to expect tonight. It turned out that we jumped on them early then were able to play more conservative."

again and scored with still 5:42 remaining in the first period.
