Foundation Awards \$200,000 In Pandemic Response Grants

Triangle North Healthcare Foundation's Board of Directors has awarded \$200,000 in grants to local organizations that are responding to community needs from the COVID-19 Pandemic.

"We are pleased to be able to assist our local agencies and nonprofits in providing relief and recovery from the effects of the Pandemic," said Val Short, executive director for the Foundation. "Our hope is that these grant awards will help keep our children and adults in Vance, Warren, Granville, and Franklin counties safe, healthy, and engaged with school and work," said Short.

The ten grants approved by the board are funding a variety of programs throughout the region, including summer enrichment programs for youth, PPE kits for elementary schools, Wi-Fi connectivity in Oxford, and healthy food boxes for those in need,

"We are very appreciative and grateful for the passionate and committed nonprofit leaders in our communities who are helping our children and families recover from the trauma of this Pandemic," said Short. "We are proud to be their partner."

The grant recipients and their projects for first round of Community Response Grants includes:

- **Boys & Girls Clubs of North Central NC – Promising Pathways-** provides opportunities for remote learning in collaboration with the local school systems, focusing on academic success, character development, and good citizenship.
- **Gang Free – Operation Cover the Child-** provides PPE (personal protective equipment) kits for elementary school students and teachers in Vance County.
- **Henderson Family YMCA – 1) Back to School Academy** – provides support and assistance with school work for students, plus supervised play and exercise activities; **2) Summer Day Camp** – provides remedial academic assistance plus traditional camp activities during the summer months.
- **Masonic Home for Children at Oxford – Academic Wellness Program** – incorporates physical activity into the online school curriculum to help students overcome sedentary habits and improve physical and mental well-being.

• **Oxford Housing Authority** – *Educational Wi-Fi Program* – covers the cost of installation and fees for internet services for 193 households in Oxford to support online connectivity for school and work.

• **Shepherd Youth Ranch** – *Trail Blazers* – Extends the Trail to Success program, which provides skill building for youth suffering from grief, loss, abandonment and abuse, to include quality time with mentors.

• **TROSA** (Triangle Residential Options for Substance Abusers, Inc.) – *Cost-free Residential Treatment During COVID-19* – funding will assist in maintaining a clean and safe environment during the Pandemic for participants in this two-year residential substance use recovery program.

• **Turning Point Community Development Corporation** – 1) *Creating Success Education Center*— provides academic enrichment for Kindergarten through Sixth Grade students during the summer months, including exploration of STEAM, Robotics, and dramatic arts. 2) *Summer Produce Box Distribution* – staff and volunteers will distribute 800 fresh food boxes to families in need during the summer; each box will feed a family of four for one week.

TNHF's Relief Program Funds Special Olympics Virtual Training

Special Olympics North Carolina received funds from the Triangle North Healthcare Foundation COVID-19 fund to implement Partner Up Power Up with Special Olympians in Franklin and Vance Counties. Partner Up Power Up is an at-home and virtual program to promote sport training and conditioning, as well as health and wellness education to individuals with intellectual disabilities. Participants who registered this spring received fitness equipment and a fitness guide that included exercise instruction, wellness tips, a weekly fitness plan, and a progress tracker that kept athletes accountable to structured wellness. Live Zoom sessions offered four days per week for 10 weeks complemented the guide. 270 participants were involved from Franklin & Vance Counties in the Partner Up Power Up program this spring. Franklin County had a total of 151 participants and Vance County had a total of 119.

Presidential Scholar Award Established for Students at VGCC

Triangle North Healthcare Foundation has given \$25,000 to the VGCC Foundation to establish a presidential scholarship that will benefit full-time students enrolled in a health career program.

Triangle North Healthcare Foundation is a nonprofit grantmaker based in Henderson, which serves the four-county northern piedmont region, including Franklin, Granville, Vance, and Warren counties. In addition to funding grants for local organizations that support health programming, the Foundation has endowed four additional scholarships at VGCC for local students pursuing health careers.
