Important Exhibitor Information

Leased Horses in Amateur Classes

A leased horse does not constitute ownership in an <u>amateur-owner class</u>. Leased horses cannot be shown in any <u>amateur</u> <u>owner</u> classes.

Rule Book

The rulebook of the USEF will prevail for the show. Any changes or corrections of rules will automatically become part of this prize list. Each class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. The Show Committee shall decide questions not covered by USEF rules and its decisions will be final. Show Management will be charged with the responsibility of enforcing all USEF and AHA Rules. Violation of any USEF or AHA rule will be cause for immediate removal from the show grounds and all moneys, ribbons, and trophies will be forfeited.

AHA MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

EACH COMPETITOR (THIS INCLUDES AT LEAST ONE RECORDED OWNER AND ALL TRAINERS, DRIVERS, RIDERS, HALTER HANDLERS, COACHES AND THE PERSON(S) SIGNING THE ENTRY BLANK) IN AN ARABIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION RECOGNIZED ARABIAN DIVISION, AT THE TIME OF ENTRY INTO A COMPETITION, MUST SUBMIT A COPY OF A VALID AHA MEMBERSHIP/COMPETITION CARD, JOIN AHA OR PAY AN AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP FEE PER COMPETITOR. WHEN AN AGENT SIGNS FOR THE OWNER AT AN AHA RECOGNIZED COMPETITION, BOTH THE OWNER AND AGENT MUST BE MEMBERS OF AHA OR PAY THE AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP. SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP FEE PER COMPETITION ALL COMPETITIONS. EXHIBITORS IN WALK-TROT CLASSES ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS AT QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS, BUT MUST HAVE AN AHA MEMBERSHIP WITH COMPETITION CARD AT AHA REGIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITIONS. EXHIBITORS IN LEAD LINE CLASSES OR PARENTS/GUARDIANS SIGNING FOR MINORS ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. (BOD 5/12)

Drugs and Medications

This show will follow the Rules and Regulations of the Drugs and Medications Rule of the USEF. The USEF Drug Test fee for all horses entered in the show is \$23 per horse (\$15 drugs & medication and \$8 administration USEF fee). It is the Responsibility of the Owner to know the rules on drugs and medications.

Dogs/All Pets

All pets must be on a leash at all times on the grounds and in buildings. USEF has warned competitions to strictly in force this rule. Pet owners are required to supply an official rabies certification showing the date & serum used. Proof of service status is required and must be promptly shown if asked to do so.

Sharps Containers

Sharps containers are available for medical waste in the stalling area.

USEF Competition Eligibility 901.9

Life, Senior Active and Junior Active Members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions, and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 non-member registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handler in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Arena

All classes, with the exception of Dressage and Sport Horse in Hand, will be held in the 112 ft x 212 ft indoor arena, which has a mixture of sand and dirt footing. All warm up rings have a mixture of sand and dirt footing. The Dressage arena is not covered or enclosed.

Judges

In the event of unforeseen circumstances, the Show Committee reserves the right to substitute judges or show officials per USEF rules. GR1211.2 (b) No contact shall be made with the judges during the period of the show unless accompanied by a member of the Show Committee designated by the Committee for such purpose. Further, no exhibitor shall approach a Judge regarding a decision without first obtaining permission from the Show Committee or USEF Steward, who shall arrange an appointment with the Judge at a proper time and place. All classes will use the Single Judging System and those placings shall prevail.

Registration Requirements

All purebred Arabian and Half Arabian/Anglo Arabian horses to be shown must have been issued a certificate of registration from the AHA Registry and/or the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry (CAHR) or the Canadian Part bred Arabian Register (CPAR), or if under one year of age, be eligible for registry, and registration applied for and must be entered under their full registered name.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited in the Arena and all barns

Protective Headgear

Effective March 1, 2011, for dressage: Anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear except those riders age 18 and over while on horses that are competing only in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St. Georges Test and the USEF Brentina Cup Test).

Discipline

Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of an owner, groom, rider, driver or member of the family of the person participating in the show will disqualify the horse from adjudication. The management reserves to itself the right to remove a groom, horse, rider, or driver from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.

USEF Liability – Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. GR906.4

Health Requirements

A negative Coggins test is required for all horses exhibited at this show and must be dated within the current calendar year. For horses entering Michigan: (Michigan Statute) all equines require a pre-approved official interstate health certificate or certificate of veterinary inspection prepared by an accredited veterinarian from the <u>State of Origin</u>. An entry permit is not required.

USEF rules also require that effective December 1,2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation-licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables.

Determining Maiden, Novice and Limit Horse or Rider

Ribbons won in one-horse classes do not count in reckoning the maiden, novice or limit status of either horse and/or rider/driver in any division. The status of Maiden, Novice or Limit entries is as of the closing date of entries, April 16. Do not count wins in one-horse classes.

Amateurs Take Note: USEF GR106 Rule

As a competitor in an amateur class at a USEF licensed competition under GR106 Amateur Classes, every contestant must hold amateur status. <u>There are no Show Passes allowed for these classes.</u>

That means: All Amateurs must be a member of USEF.

Driver's License Statement

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Campers

The camping fee is \$100 per unit during the show **regardless of length of stay**. All **camper units/tents that are occupied overnight must display a valid permit that can be purchased at the Show Office**. Permits must be visibly displayed. Running of generators after midnight is prohibited. Camping is allowed in designated areas only. No horse trailers except those with living quarters may park in camping areas. **Camping not paid for at the time of registration will be charged an additional* \$25 *or a total of* \$125 *for the duration of the show*.

Refund Policy and Class Cancellations

If a horse is withdrawn from the show for any reason by April 21, 2018 all fees shall be refunded. After April 21, 2018, requests for refund of <u>class fees</u> will be considered on an individual basis. Refund requests should be given to the Show Secretary prior to the end of the show. Requests for refunds must be in writing with a Veterinarian's statement as to reason for cancellation of classes. Refund checks will be mailed after the Show Committee's decision. <u>Class Cancellations</u>: The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel a class if there are fewer than five entries, in which case all entry fees for that class will be refunded. If the Show Committee finds it necessary, it may also split a class. In this event, duplicate awards will be presented. Class fees will be refunded for any classes cancelled due to weather conditions.

Public Address System

The public address system in the barns is used to call classes. **This is a courtesy only**. It is up to each exhibitor to be aware of the class schedule and to arrive at the gate at the proper time. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing when their class is being judged. A two-minute hold will be in effect at the gate. The announcer and the gate attendant should be notified when a conflict in classes occurs.

Submit Complete Entries

1. Include the complete name and address of owners, trainers, riders, handlers, drivers and walk-trot riders.

2. The horse owner's name must be exactly as it appears on the registration papers. Leased horses need a copy of the lease agreement. No leased horses may exhibit in an Amateur Owner class.

3. AHA non-members may pay a \$35 single event fee. USEF non-member fees are \$45. Walk-trot 10 & Under, Lead line exhibitors, and parents who sign as trainers for their children are not required to be members of either organization.

4. The back of the entry form must have all necessary signatures including owner, trainer, rider, handler, and driver. A parent/guardian signature for all exhibitors less than 18 years of age is required. A professional trainer, parent or child

may sign as the trainer. *Trainer in this case means the person responsible for the care and wellbeing of the horse*. Failure to complete all of the signatures on the back may result in a \$250 USEF fine should the entry need to be sent to USEF for any reason.

5. Include a photocopy of the horse's Coggins Test. The original copy will be verified at check-in.

6. Enclose your check or other payment instrument. Check for full payment or open check must be made out to **AHAM**, signed, and dated.

7. Enclose the stall request sheet located within this booklet. People requesting stalling together must have each other's names listed on the "stall with" section and must get their entries in by April 16, 2018. If a tack stall is being shared by two or more people, the cost of the stall must be paid in full by one person.

No fee will be charged to change a class if a class is added <u>at the same time</u> a class is scratched. Scratched classes with no added class will not be refunded. The scratch and add must be completed in the Show Office prior to the classes scratched and added. Any difference in fees from the scratched class and the added class will be paid by the exhibitor.
 Settlements will be calculated and paid <u>in their entirety</u> by either the trainer or the owner. Settlement of fees and closing out open checks should be done no less than one hour after the last class ends. <u>You may check out earlier when you have entered the last class</u> – but make sure it is the last class.

Stalls/Shavings/Time of Arrival

For Advance Stall Reservations, you may call or text **Ron Gekiere**, **586-484-8790 or email him at** <u>rongeki@gmail.com</u>. (DO <u>NOT INSTANT MESSAGE HIM</u>). Advance reservation will be accepted followed by a signed open check, <u>sent to Ron Gekiere</u> to confirm the reservation. No stalls may be resold except by Show Management. All stalls have cement floors and doors. Please note: the MSU Pavilion will assess a \$150 fine per stall to anyone who takes a stall apart and does not replace or straighten all items EXACTLY. Please note any problem with a stall before use and report any broken or misaligned item to the Show Office or MSU Pavilion Management. A stall assignment map will be posted outside of the show office. The Show Management reserves the right to reassign tack stalls for use as additional horse stalls if needed. No changes in stabling will be permitted without Show Management's permission. No first bedding will be provided.

<u>Arrival</u>: Admission to the show grounds will not be allowed before Wednesday, May 2nd, 2018 at 8:00 am. All parking will be in designated areas only. Stallion owners: We have no control regarding the gender of the horses in the adjoining stalls. It is the responsibility of the Stallion Owners to provide equipment or barriers to protect their horses as well as the neighboring horses.

<u>Shavings</u>: No first bedding will be provided. Shavings may be purchased from MSU by contacting or Scott Rancour of MSU at 517-432-5566. Note that MSU requires that AHAM have an open check on file from you in order for shavings to be delivered. The sale or delivery of shavings by any other vendor is not allowed. No grain or hay will be available for sale at this show.



• Equine Health: The Importance of Vaccines and Vaccinating Your Horse

Presented by: Dr. Judith Marteniuk, DVM, MS Associate Professor, Large Animal Clinical Sciences Michigan State University

Dr. Marteniuk earned her DVM from Western College of Veterinary Medicine in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan in 1975 and then completed a rotating internship at the same institution. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this division is to introduce potential new owners to the joys of showing and riding Arabian horses by giving beginning riders of any breed and opportunity to gain experience by offering beginner classes at our Arabian horse shows.

RIDERS

- Riders are encouraged to be in a professionally operated lesson program but it is NOT REQUIRED
- Encouraged but NOT REQUIRED to be a member of AHA
- Riding suits and chaps are NOT allowed
- Riding pants, jodhpurs, breeches, or colored jeans are considered appropriate, as are neatly fitted shirts, tops and sweaters.
- A riding helmet IS MANDATORY for riders 18 and younger, and suggested for riders of all ages
- Appropriate footwear with a small heel is MANDATORY
- Riders are NOT allowed to cross enter into any non-ACT riding classes, and are ineligible to compete in ACT classes once they have shown in a full riding suit or in a non-ACT or non-Academy show.

HORSES/PONIES

Horses are encouraged to be lesson horses of any breed and should display the characteristics of such, but it is not mandatory that they are utilized in a professional lesson – <u>all horses are welcome</u>, <u>as long as they display good manners and a quiet disposition</u>. Tack – a cut-back saddle for saddle seat, western saddle for stock seat, and hunt saddle for hunt seat are to be used. Work bridles and bits, including snaffles, are allowed, and running martingales are permitted and encouraged. Tie-down martingales are **NOT ALLOWED**.

Horses may cross enter in ANY ACT classes, but riders may not cross enter between the Leadline, Walk/Trot, the Walk/Trot Equitation or the Walk/Trot/Canter classes. ACT entries are to follow horse show rules but are not AHA or USEF sanctioned classes. Show grooming is permitted, but not necessary as **HORSES ARE NOT TO BE JUDGED**.

Horse-show management may eliminate any horse or rider that is deemed unsafe or is not abiding by these rules.

JUDGING

All ACT classes are to be judged on the ability of the rider to control and show their horse to its best advantage, and upon the riding skills of the rider.

Each class should be judged on the rider's basic equitation and horsemanship skills suited to the class discipline, with emphasis placed on the rider's ability to control the horse at all times, identify correct diagonals and leads promptly, and to control their horse's rate in a consistent manner.

Riders should convey the impression of good posture, balance and effective control while commanding proper speed of gaits and show ring placement.

Headers are allowed in the line- up in all walk/trot classes.

HORSES ARE NOT TO BE JUDGED, only the rider's ability to control themselves and their horse and present themselves to their best advantage.

Horsemanship Pleasure is meant to differ from the equitation class in that it is judged more on the rider's ability to display their horse to its best advantage, communicating to the judge through their horsemanship and riding abilities that the horse is a pleasure to ride and can be guided and set up to show to its best advantage.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits</u>: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Member Guide or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

<u>Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions</u>: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or

owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

Directions from points North

Follow US 27 South to US 127 South. Follow US 127 South to Trowbridge Road (exit 106). Follow Trowbridge Road east to Harrison Road (Trowbridge ends at Harrison). Turn south (right) onto Harrison Road. Follow Harrison Road south approximately 1½ miles to it's end at Forest Road. Turn east (left) on Forest Road. Follow Forest Road approximately 3/4 mile to the entrance off College Road. Turn left. The Pavilion is on the northeast corner of Forest and College Roads.

Directions from Grand Rapids and points West

Follow I-96 to Business I-496 East (exit 95). Follow I-496 East to Trowbridge Road (exit 106). Follow Trowbridge Road east to Harrison Road (Trowbridge ends at Harrison). Turn south (right) onto Harrison Road. Follow Harrison Road South approximately 1½ miles to it's end at Forest Road. Turn east (left) on Forest Road.
