

Come join us on April 25, 2016 as we head to the Pin Point Heritage Museum in Pin Point, Georgia just south of Savannah as we celebrate the “Year of the Oyster”. Located in the old A.S. Varn & Son Oyster and Crab Factory, the Pin Point Museum will allow us to experience the Gullah/Geechee culture first hand. For nearly 100 years, Pin Point was an isolated and self-sustaining community on the banks on the Moon River. Founded by the Gullah/Geechee, this community is where family, religion and work connected to the river. Today, this refurbished factory allows visitors to celebrate the life, work and history of the Gullah/Geechee people.

So mark your calendar for April 25th for a fun and informative day! The cost for the admission to the Pin Point Heritage Museum is \$12.00 per person for DIHF Members and \$17.00 per person for Non-Members. The admission price includes a private group tour of the Pin Point Heritage Museum as well as a special Crabbing demonstration for our group. Following the tour, we will enjoy a delicious lunch at the Driftaway Café for “casual, coastal cuisine”. Please note that each attendee will be responsible for the cost of his or her own lunch.

We will plan on taking the 8:40 AM Haig Point Ferry on April 25<sup>th</sup> (passes will be available for Haig Point non-members) and will drive directly to the Pin Point Heritage Museum for our 10:30 AM tour.
