Welcome to our interim facility at First Friends in uptown Whittier. As we sojourn here for a few months, we begin to feel most acutely like our ancestors who wandered in the Judean and Sinai deserts on their way to their eventual home.

This month we celebrate the festival of our freedom and peoplehood, Pesah. We will begin the celebration with an Erev Shabbat Pesah service in the sanctuary beginning at 5:45 pm on Friday night, April 19. We will recite the evening festival and Shabbat liturgy as well as the famed once a year prayer for dew (Tal). This beautiful prayer shows the majesty of the poetry in which we ask the divine to continue to provide moisture to our land so that we may continue to grow and provide food to sustain our lives. This will be followed in the Social Hall with a congregational Seder for those who reserve ahead. The Seder acutely reminds us of our struggles to become a free and independent people. It is also a time to enjoy the fruits of our continued communal strength and coming together as one family.

The following Shabbat will focus on the concluding part of the festival and the reading of how our ancestors came across the Reed Sea to freedom from the Torah and our Yizkor Memorial prayers. Though we will not yet have our new virtual Memorial Board to see our dear departed names for this festival, we can remember them in our minds and hearts and always keep them close to us. Pesah was and is always a time to bring families together to celebrate being Jewish!

May this festival of freedom and joy bring you closer to your family and friends and to our community and may you always know that we stand together as a strong unit at Beth Shalom!



As we shared our last service in the Hawes St. building, the emotions and memories were evident on people's faces. The service was beautiful and meaningful as usual. During the Oneg, many people came back to the sanctuary to look around, touch the familiar ark and torahs or just sit and reminisce.

I planned on writing an article on our "new beginnings". But that is not really true. We are not at all beginning "new". We are continuing on. Yes, we are going to a new building but we are continuing the story that was started by the Whittier Jewish Community Center and then the ground-breaking for this building in 1955.

This building has been wonderful for us. Many of the people here for the last service were once students here and were confirmed or had their Bnai' Mitzvahs here. Some converted to Judaism and had their first experiences as Jews here. Some were 2nd, 3rd or 4th generations of their families to worship here and some were fairly new to Beth Shalom.

Just when I was standing there feeling like I was leaving a piece of my mother behind, my grand-son came to stand by me and say that great-grandma would be so happy and proud that we are making sure that Beth Shalom would be able to continue on. That was when I knew that this is a continuation of our story, not a new story. It is a new chapter but who knows what wonderful things might be in store for our community as this story continues to be written.

This building has given us so much – and it continues to give. The final gift this building has given us is to provide us with the financial means to continue on as a community. We have the flexibility to make a new building into a home for us, and keep us solvent for years to come. Who knows what could happen during that time? Those chapters are not yet written. We are fortunate to have dedicated congregants who work hard to make the dream of the continuation of Beth Shalom a reality.

Beth Shalom - (House of Peace)

We are now located in our temporary housing at the First Friends religious abode in Whittier on Philadelphia Street. We are a conservative synagogue which means devotion to Halakhah (Jewish Law) while attuned to modern sensibilities-women participate equally in all aspects of our congregation in all its services.

I am glad that Beth Shalom is still alive, and will contribute to its contribution of prayer to our one G-d. This is emphasized in our Shema Prayer, "Hear, O Israel: The lord our G-D, the lord is one." (Deut 6:4) This is the most important single sentence in the Jewish world. It is recited in our daily morning service (Shacharis) and evening service (naariv). This prayer swears our allegiance to G-d to his law of justice, mercy, freedom and equality. It means that we love our people and want to dedicate them to the service of G-d, his law, and his chosen people.

Spiritual Orientation

In our sanctuary, if you are a new member, please introduce yourself, you are among friends. If you come to services regularly, you will learn our customs and how to participate. In turn you will be spiritually elevated. Jewish tradition teaches that praying (Davening) is a form of meditation, when entering a meditative mood you become in contact with your soul. This enables you to open yourself to other people, and give love to them and to G-d. Always remember, Beth Shalom is always G-d's house and also your house.

<u>Davening</u>



Read prayers aloud or whisper them, moving your lips (in Jewish prayer, reading silently is not considered praying). Try to say the prayers with feeling, mean what you say. Reflect on the prayers and try to understand them. Do not be surprised if some of them express ideas contrary to your own views. Part of your work in Jewish prayer is to become familiar with traditional views. Focus on the parts that speak to you. Try to keep up; with the congregation, but do not worry if you lag behind. Do not rush and lose your meditative mood. If you skip a prayer here or here, it is OK. If you lose your place in the Siddur, ask the person next to you and they will be glad to help.

If you do not read Hebrew, please the English. If you are reading the Hebrew, without understanding it, then read the English occasionally to reflect on what you are saying. When reciting the prayers in Hebrew, consider the words in the Holy tongue as vehicles carrying your innermost thoughts and deepest spiritual longings to G-d. When the congregation sings a melody for a prayer, consider the spiritual messages of the melody as primary and the words as secondary. If you feel comfortable doing so, it is a good practice occasionally during the service, to utter short personal prayers for what you need or what a friend or a loved one needs.

Our services are open to all of G-d's children. I pray that each of you will join together to praise G-d, and serve him with thanks and everlasting love. Please join us for the Oneg Shabbat or Kiddush that follows our prayers.
