From the Minister's Mac

"A Glorious Season of Easter"

This Easter, we had over 150 people in worship, between the sunrise service at 6:30 and our traditional service at 9:30. I saw people who attend the sunrise service yearly, new babies, new visitors, and at our 9:30 service, visiting relatives, old friends who have been absent due to illness, and the faithful who attend regularly. The meal between services was delicious, with ham, sticky buns, and a variety of egg dishes. Sunday music was wonderful, capping off a week of special music that was so inspiring. As folks left each service on Sunday, the overwhelming response was, "What a glorious Easter!"

I pray for all of us that the spirit of Easter carries on through the season of Easter, which continues until Pentecost on May 24th. Our Church tells us, "Easter Season has two main formational purposes: to teach Christian doctrine richly and to prepare persons for ministry in the gifts and power of the Holy Spirit and in Christ's name."

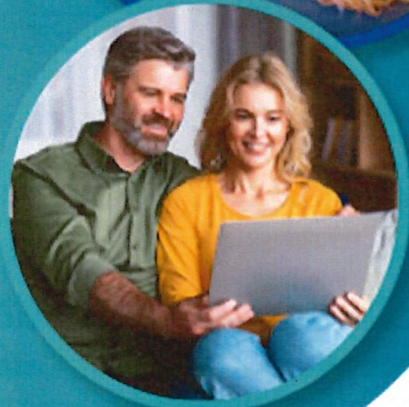
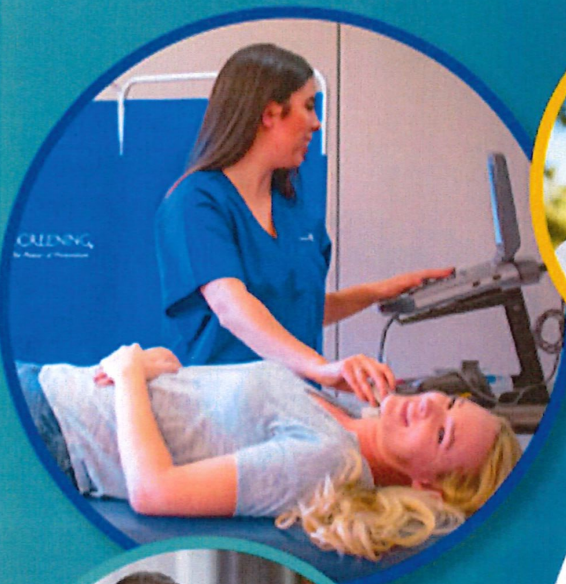
