Dear Friends,

Our Church Council has approved the creation of a new part-time staff position of a Director of Communications. This position is being created to assist me in preparing the print and web publications of our congregation. When Stateline Literacy could no longer financially sustain their presence here, we found ourselves with significant cashflow problems. The only way for us to remain solvent was to eliminate our secretarial position. I had initially thought that I could complete the duties of that position in addition to my own, but unfortunately this has been more overwhelming than I expected. Additionally, it has prevented me from moving forward on projects such as the puppet ministry, live-streaming our Divine Service, etc. This new position will be for seven hours per week and will include the following responsibilities: preparing and printing the weekly worship bulletin, editing and printing the monthly newsletter, checking the congregation's voicemail, checking and responding to emails in the congregation's office account, checking the altar flower chart in the narthex and ordering altar flowers, maintaining the congregation's website, posting events and items of interest to the congregation's Facebook page, duplicating and preparing the CD's of the congregation's weekly service, duplicating board & council minutes for the monthly Council packet, duplicating Sunday school lesson materials when needed, collating and duplicating the annual report, filing of bulletins and other documents both electronically (Google Drive) and in print, maintaining the congregation's Gmail calendar - birthdays, anniversaries, and other events, and preparing and sending out limited correspondence acknowledgements of gifts, baptismal information, etc.

In order to attract a highly-qualified candidate who may already be serving in such a capacity in a full-time position, this position provides flexible hours and the ability to perform certain tasks from home. The Legacy Fund Committee has approved the funding of this position from the Legacy Fund. The Board of Personnel and Planning will be carrying out the search process for candidates. We are looking for candidates with experience in website publishing and expertise in using Microsoft Office (Word and Publisher). We are seeking someone who is able to take initiative and can create well-crafted messages from input provided by boards and committees. Please keep this process in your prayers.


