



Events must be planned, budgets must be created, and bills must be paid...on time. Our membership director will be sending an email on November 1<sup>st</sup>



## **What I did in the garage these last few weeks** *by Mark Leder*

Getting ready for the Great Northern Tour, I needed to go through and closely look at my car. I drove a modest amount this summer and noticed that on my check list of things to do was tighten up and adjust my brakes. Other normal items are a complete lubrication and fluid check; my oil change interval is its replacement mark so that needed to be done. I like to peck away at things so I don't overwhelm myself, I choose an item or two that should be able to get completed in a ½ day. Look at the distributor and electrical connections as well as those in the terminal box, oil distributor shaft and lube cam, clean up and dust or grime inside and outside of the distributor body. Check lug nuts, tires inflation and rubber wear. One item on a tour I've seen give way is the muffler connection to the manifold. Those bolts have nuts and with the heat cycles they seem to loosen up – so check them. Of course, always look for leaks on the coolant hoses and the petcock. Water pump lube, inspect fan belt and try to wiggle the fan and see if it is tight to the shaft. If you have an original fan blade, please remove it and replace it with an aluminum replacement or a plastic one. It's the safe thing to do for the people around you and the hood and radiator that the original fan will damage.

I had one unfortunate failure this year which mostly I fixed but it still had some hangover. Shortly after taking the car out from winter storage and driving a little I noticed the glass sediment bowl looked like someone put oatmeal in it. My cork gasket between the bowl and housing turned to mush. My car was not starting like it should. I found all the crud mostly in the glass container, but some got into my carburetor. I pulled the carburetor for a cleaning and rebuild. I cleaned everything, new internal gaskets, set float, checked for leaks – all good. Put carburetor on car and ran great, took a road trip of 125 miles to see the Twine ball in Darwin MN. it ran great. Took various runs for ice cream and fun little rides and it ran great. Lately did not start as fast, I would come to a stop sign and slow down, and the motor would quit at the full stop unless I would raise my throttle speed as I approach the stop.

So, I pulled the carb and thought about float level problem, I changed float valve gasket to a different thickness, one time thinner one time thicker didn't help. Now I'm trying to think through the problem while the car is running, and it is not as silky smooth as usual. I adjust air mixture, Gav and idle adjustments to no avail. One trick I use is open the passenger door and fix my eye on the top of the door and look behind. The door will bounce and as I adjust the carb idle and air mixture, I can see door less or more bouncy. Less bouncy means smooth and the best of the adjustments. It still is not right! Now I go to the tailpipe, and I hear the puka, puka, faintest miniature cough, puka. Now I believe I've got a leak with the carburetor to manifold connection. I replace the gasket with a copper one I had and that's what it was. I open the door, then sight down the door and adjust idle and air, then smooth is what I see, test drive is great at the stop sign and starts on half a turn. ,

Our first Clinic after the summer off was on September 11<sup>th</sup>. This was an advertised but not normally scheduled clinic. For our members to remember, normal clinics are the 3<sup>rd</sup>. Thursday of the month unless a holiday or building space commitment interrupts. Our membership came together on this night for a parking lot swap meet as an appetizer and then into the building for a welcome back. There was a a lot of catching up between members and a few A's showed up in the parking lot. That was so nice to see!

Our clinic coordinator Dale Pomerleau had a series of updates and announcements for us . There were new members present that introduced themselves as our custom , we have new members stand up and tell us a little bit about themselves, their cars and just what our members might be able help them with. There is always coffee and treats in the back room.

Once all we were settled in, the featured topic of the night was a presentation in somewhat of an interview format of Steve Barnacle's recent road trip mishap that damaged his car in an accident.

The program featured photos and background of the trip and the point of the accident. The car was undrivable and very far from home.

In a question and answer format, Mark Leder asked Steve a series of questions from a script that dealt with just how you deal with an antique car insurance claim. Interaction with police at the scene, paperwork requirements, contacting the insurance company, how an adjuster works with you, determining amount of loss, what is covered and what is not, getting payment, resolving a dispute between the insured and the company. These questions and many others were asked of Steve, and he responded. We then opened the floor up for questions from the membership. This was an interesting discussion and a learning experience for anyone else should they suffer a similar loss. Now at least they will have some knowledge of how the process works.

For those that were unable to attend, this very progressive club that you are members of, have a page on YouTube and this presentation as well as others are recorded and placed there for your viewing pleasure. Simply go to YouTube, type in TCMAFC in the search bar and look at all the content. This nights program only after being "up" on the site for fifteen days has already recieved 105 views and may more will follow. The club recently spent some of our treasury funds for technology upgrades for clinic presentations, a new powerful computer, camera and high definition projector and various accessories. We used it for the first time for this night and there was a remarkable quality upgrade from what we were using. Blaine Maus took on the duties of running this equipment and selecting the items to purchase and it really is a great improvement and will only get better as Blaine gets experienced with it, he deserves many thanks for willingness work on this project. He along with Jerome Bockelmann worked hard on this. Jerome did this for the last few years and as well did a great job. The new equipment should keep our programs and archived programs enjoyable for all of our members either in the room or at a distant location.
