Because of vour prayers and generosity, the replacement of the 33-yearold HVAC sys-

tem started on Monday, November 25, 2024! HURT HVAC Company of Richmond, a well-established and trusted African-American business, is diligently working to ensure the kitchen, restrooms, multi-purpose room, and administrative offices will benefit from the new heating, venting and airconditioning system.

The HVAC replacement and installation was at the top This current phase will of the list. cost \$35,000 and we celebrate how the BGCVA faith community has responded to the financial costs for this initial phase. Your giving of \$19,386 (as of this printing) is greatly appreciated. The pictures on this page give you an idea of the depth and scope of the work that is being done.

While this project has started, the need for continued and sustained financial support from our members, churches, individuals, and associations is greater than ever. BAPTIST GENERAL CONVENTION OF VIRGINIA COMPLETING ITS FIRST PHASE OF ITS MULTI-MILLION DOLLAR GRANT



The Baptist General Convention of Virginia (BGCVA) is pleased to share that it is completing the first phase of its five-year, \$1,250,000.00 Lilly Endowment Grant initiative. Thirty-six churches have participated in the initiative that is designed to assist congregations by helping them deepen their relationships with God, enhance their connections with each other, and contribute to the vitality of their communities and the world. The Lilly Grant team walked alongside the churches by providing curriculum and guidance to assist congregations in meeting the goals of the grant. The curriculum created, allowed churches to incorporate the study into the life of their church, based on their needs. Churches that have completed the three-part curriculum will continue to partner with the BGC's Lilly Grant team in receiving optional wraparound services to further meet their needs to honor the work for the Kingdom of God.

Additionally, the Lilly Endowment grant provided churches the opportunity to apply for individual grants in the amount of \$1,500. Twenty-five churches, including congregations that are not part of the cohort initia-

tive, applied for the one-time Church Learning Grant. The grant is specifically for churches. Other organizations and associations are welcome to call the BGCVA if they have questions or want to inquire about opportunities that the Convention provides.

The Church Learning grant is designed to help churches identify and execute community-based programs in response to growing needs that will benefit the community. Some of the needs may have been prompted by the realities of the pandemic and its continuing effect on communal life. The grants will be awarded in December of this year, 2024.

BGCVA and the Lilly Grant team are honored to have been selected by the Lilly Endowment's Thriving Congregations Initiative to do the work of "Bringing, Growing and Changing Congregations and Communities Together". We hope that your church will take full advantage of these opportunities cohort teams and the Church Learning Grant-- in ways that will help your congregation and your community. 


