To encourage participation in the democratic process, this monthly column aims to inform members about current legislation and programs that are germane to the GFWC Resolutions. It also highlights important actions of Congress and the White House, and provides follow-up information about GFWC Legislative Action Alerts.

Protect Children from Al Chatbots: GFWC cosigned a letter of support for the bipartisan GUARD Act (Guidelines for User Age-Verification and Responsible Dialogue Act of 2025, S. 3062). The bill would ban Al companies from providing AI companions to minors, and mandate that AI companions disclose their non-human status and lack of professional credentials for all users. The bill also creates new crimes for companies that knowingly make available to minors AI companions that solicit or produce sexual content.
