And funny thing, while typing this list, it struck me that most of these could be done through the church (hint, hint). Maybe we should start singing the alphabet song together on Sunday mornings.


Regardless, I continue to look forward seeing you at United Church in 2025!

Happy August from your Music Ministry department!

A big thank you to my friend, **Miguel Jackson**, for blessing us with his beautiful tenor voice at our July 20 service! He promises to be a visitor again soon!





Unfortunately, on that same weekend, I heard that we lost one of our faithful choir members, **L. Joe Ford**. Joe was involved in church music his entire life. There were several Sundays when I could tell his walking wasn't stable, when he came up the steps to thank each member of our Praise Team plus Beverly and Floyd because he was so moved by our music that morning. I can imagine that God's heavenly choir is rejoicing to have Joe in their ranks. Rest in peace, my friend.

Another musician who blesses us every Sunday is Reverend **Floyd Ellison**, with his incredible expressive piano solos. We'd like to feature a little more background on Floyd today:

Floyd was born and raised in Illinois, the fifth of eight children. He completed elementary, high school and college in IL and later received seminary degrees in Berkeley CA.

In his early years and through college he served as accompanist for high school choirs and band soloists, and for college music recitalists. He was an accompanist for the Augustana College (IL) Choir, rehearsal accompanist for the Oakland (CA) Light Opera Association, and more recently an accompanist for Broadway Shows at Sun City (AZ) Community Theater. He served as well as an organist in numerous churches in IL and CA.

Ordained in 1964, he served two churches before he was called to active duty as a Navy Chaplain. He served thirteen tours of duty over twenty-five years of service. Duty stations included a squadron of destroyers, an aircraft carrier, a Marine Airwing, numerous chapels throughout the US, and overseas tours in Europe, Okinawa, Korea, Guam and at a Navy Hospital. His travels have taken him to all fifty states and forty-seven countries.

He gave the table blessing at a luncheon honoring the visit of Prince Andrew and Princess Fergie onboard USS NIMITZ and directed the first-ever Christmas Cantata sung on this carrier.

Upon retirement from the Chaplain Corps, Floyd was cited by the Secretary of the Navy and the Chief of Naval Operations "for superior service in delivering Ministry and Social Services to service personnel" and was awarded the Legion of Merit Medal.

He then began a dual Pastoral and Music Ministry, serving as organist and frequent preacher at a church in CA. Simultaneously, he provided care for three young grandchildren and became their legal guardian upon the death of their mother when they were in elementary school. Retiring from his dual ministry after twenty-two years, he moved to Surprise to be near his former wife, who died in 2023. You see Floyd in church at the piano and in the pulpit when he is not traveling.

When he is asked his age, Floyd normally responds "I'm still this side of eighty." Recently when asked, he responded "I am the same age as the number of keys on a piano."

Floyd's spiritual gifts are music, preaching, and friendship (he communicates regularly with twenty surviving high classmates out of a class of forty-two). His friends are many. His family includes three children (one deceased), seven grandchildren and three greatgrandchildren, two younger sisters and a whole bunch of nieces and nephews.



On Sunday, March 17, 2024, United Church helped Floyd celebrate his 60th anniversary year of Ordination (see the April 2024 Newsletter for details and pictures). We thank you, Floyd, for being a vital member of our Ministry!

We also thank **Andrea Dixon** for being our "guest tenor" for the months of June and July. She's always so well prepared and a joy to work with!



Boni Locke has generously agreed to be our guest tenor for the months of August and September. Boni not only solos on her flute whenever I ask, she also sings soprano, alto and tenor very well, plus being the chair for our Music Ministry Board on the Church Council. Thank you, Boni!




Greetings from your Parish Nurse....

Our "Converse and Connect" group on Wednesday mornings is studying a book called as Silver Refined." In it, the author has helped us to look at a cycle that we often fall into of discouragement and depression. She calls them "The Deadly D's."

The list begins with **disappointment**. How often have you been disappointed in your circumstances, your job, or disappointed in other people—your family or friends, your church. Disappointment is usually when our expectations of our circumstances or relationships was not met—or not met in the way we wanted.

When we are disappointed, it is easy to fall into **discouragement.** We often rehearse all the ways we have been disappointed over our lifetime. We feel disheartened and may just want to give up. It would be so easy to walk away.



Next may come different levels of depression. The first is **dejection**. This is a lowness of spirit, a feeling of spiritual and emotional fatigue. Have you ever thought, "I'm just too tired or too old to deal with this!"? This lack of energy and finding yourself sleeping more during the day may be a symptom of this kind of fatigue.

Dejection may be followed by **despair** when we are just not sure what we can do about anything. It may leave us questioning and struggling with the simplest of decision.

And finally, **demoralization.** At this point, our hope is often replaced by apathy and numbness. It feels like "I just don't care anymore." "Nothing I can do will make a difference."

Have you ever felt these things? I know I have. It's a very easy cycle to fall into in our ever changing and sometimes frightening world. Things seem to be so out of control.

But the author makes the point that God IS in control. And that the disappointments and difficulties we face are actually an opportunity to see God and ourselves in a new way. To recognize that these are His Appointments for us in learning to lean on Him in difficult (or impossible) situations.

Please let me know if you are struggling with feelings like these. Being able to talk about it helps us to recognize that we are not alone. And feel free to join us on Wednesdays at 10:00 am in the Beehive as we continue to study this book. All are welcome.
