A Blast from the Past While Rev. Lin is on Vacation

In the early 1980s, several churches joined together for an ecumenical Lenten experience. Ash Wednesday at one church, Maundy Thursday at another, Good Friday at a third, and then an Easter Sunrise Service at a local park. We publicized the Sunrise Service at the park in the local paper (remember when that was a thing?) with an ad that read, "This year, 5 churches will join together for an Easter Sunrise Service. Rise to the occasion! He did!"

It was one of those Easters I will always remember. It was cold that day and the grass in the park was wet with dew. Strangely for that day and hour, there was a lot of loud, distracting traffic on the nearby boulevard. The music was not amplified and was hard to hear, especially with the wind blowing, and there was a mix-up about who was supposed to bring the song sheets for everyone, leaving the congregation to sing from memory.

Yet, in spite of it all, it was a glorious service. People came who were not from any of the churches. They saw the ad or the crowd, or heard the music that had drifted to them on the wind. They asked those of us standing at the back of the crowd what was going on.

"It's a Sunrise Service," was the explanation.

"Oh, are you sun worshippers?" was a follow up question.

Another person asked, "Is this one of those group baptisms?"

"No, it's a worship service."

The onlooker was puzzled. "You worship in a park?"

"Well, this Easter we do."

"In the park? For Easter?"

Our witness was working, but we were surprised by the questions it raised. What were we worshipping? Was this something vaguely familiar to them, like baptism? Maybe they understood worship, but worship in the park? For Easter? What's going on here?

I imagine that question was asked often with Jesus. "What's going on here?" as the crowds gathered for the Sermon on the Mount, the feeding of the 5000, and the multitude at the seaside. "What's going on here?" as people witnessed the cleansing of the Temple, the salvation of Zacchaeus, the raising of Lazarus and the entry into Jerusalem. How many times were people drawn to what Jesus was doing, yet still did not understand the full meaning behind what they were seeing?

Just like in Jesus' time, that Easter Sunrise Service in the park also attracted those who were open to what was happening, who joined in the singing, who asked deeper questions about faith and Jesus and the resurrection. We stood in the cold, wet grass after the service was over, talking with those who stayed, inviting them for coffee and donuts at the church next door, letting them know they were welcome and loved.

Friends, Easter is all around us, all the time. We are Easter people. We celebrate the resurrection one way or another every Sunday, and are encouraged to carry the light of Christ out into the world. May we find new ways to connect with those who have not yet seen the light of Christ, who have not yet felt the love and grace of God. May we, as Easter people, continue to do active work and worship which attracts people, invites them in, and causes them to ask, "What's going on here?"
