Curator's Statement

The world of children's books is an eternal illusion of a perfect world, appealing to both children and adults (since it is mainly parents, after all, who decide which book to purchase, sometimes following their own taste, sometimes the wishes of their children).

In our society, it is very difficult to meet a person who didn't grow up with at least one children's book. These books offer us the very first information on life in society, teach us attitudes, suggest real or imaginary role models, and provide an idea of how the world works. We also learn to perceive colors, shapes, sounds, and typography with the help of these books—which now exist in so many formats, from printed pages, to fabric toys, to interactive iPad adventures.

The purpose of this exhibition is to showcase examples of professional children's book illustration from around the world. As you observe the works up close, notice that the illustrations are often more than they seem. The drawings are rarely just a *literal* depiction of reality; instead, there is always a lens that the illustrator adds. The ability to add the right lens—and to expand on a story through their visual interpretation—often requires the artist to possess the qualities of a teacher, psychologist, writer, historian, designer, magician and most importantly, dreamer. Over the past few decades, children's illustration has undergone significant changes. It sprouted centuries ago as a competitive, *elite profession*, and gradually transformed into something some might think of more as an *exclusive hobby* in which we still see an incredibly high level of competition, but no guarantee of a comfortable existence. In order to stay competitive, it is now almost a requirement for children's illustrators to be employed in related fields such as graphic design, animation, typography or education.

Although some may profess that all media is moving into the digital realm, over the last decade it has been my pleasure to notice publishers' renewed interest in illustrators who are able to work in traditional (non-digital) media. Such masters are scarce now, making them increasingly in demand.

So my advice to students is this: if you are seriously interested in this field, master not only digital but also traditional illustration skills, and learn to write well. Publishers are always looking for something new and unique; plus, they are happy to collaborate with artists who can also write their own books. With grit and determination, you WILL succeed. Take a look around this exhibition for inspiration. Good luck!

Margaret CUSACK USA

I studied graphic design, typography, printmaking, drawing, animation, sculpture and painting at Pratt Institute, but later chose fabric and thread as my medium for creating artworks and illustrations. I applied my previous training to this unconventional medium: samplers, stitched artworks, illustrations, hangings, and soft sculptures.



"Why fabric?" is a question that is always asked. The answer is: To me, fabric is instantaneous color, pattern and texture. It also evokes emotion, memory and nostalgia. I use fabric to transmit these qualities to the viewer. I enjoy creating realism using the interplay of patterns and textures.

Since 1972, my stitched images have been used primarily for illustrations and large hangings, but I have also created stitched props, costumes, quilts and portraits that have been used in children's books, posters, advertisements, magazines, etc. My book, *Picture Your World in Appliqué*, published by Watson-Guptill Publications, includes many of my artworks.

Nancy DONIGER USA

When I was a little girl, I loved to draw. I drew so much, that finally my parents put chalkboard all around the walls of my room. Then, I could draw as high as I could reach! I studied psychology and art at Rutgers College, New Brunswick, NJ, where I received my BA. After graduating, I studied painting

and drawing at the New York Studio School in NYC, and later painting, drawing and illustration at Parsons and SVA. I began my illustration career working mainly in black and white cut paper. I liked the way one can convey light and shadow and emotions with simple, bold imagery in that medium. I created many pieces for the *New York Times*, as well as other publications.

When I began working in color, I returned to cut paper. For *Morning Noon and Night: Poems to Fill Your Day*, I developed the texture of the collage further by using painted papers. Since then I have created illustrations in a variety of media, depending which best fit the project: paper collage, digital 'cut outs' or, as in my latest children's book Lemonade, and Other Poems Squeezed from a Single Word, brush and ink with watercolor.


Daria FISHER USA




Valerie SOKOLOVA USA




Madeline SOREL USA






Stefan TURK ITALY/SLOVENIA


Stefano VITALE ITALY

Ivan MALKOVYCH, Publisher UKRAINE

Poet and publisher Ivan Malkovych founded the publishing house *A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA*. Born in 1961 in Bereziv Nyzhniy in the Ukrainian Carpathian Mountains, he graduated from the violin class of the Ivano-Frankivsk Music Academy and from the Faculty of Philology at

Taras Shevchenko State University in Kiev. As an editor, compiler, author, and translator of dozens of books for children, Malkovych has been called by *The Book Review* "a man maniacally devoted to the idea of 'the Ukrainian book of especially good quality."

A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA, the first privately-owned children's book publisher to be established in an independent Ukraine, is Ukraine's finest children's book publisher and one of the most esteemed producers of children's literature in Central and Eastern Europe. Translated from baby talk, "A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA" means "the alphabet" and indeed the first title published in July 1992 was the picture book *The Ukrainian Alphabet*. More than half of *A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA's* titles have won awards at book competitions, and several million children "from 2 to 102" through their patronage consider *A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA* books their favorite.

The remarkable artistic and aesthetic qualities of *A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA* editions reflect the publisher's continuing collaboration with outstanding illustrators such as Vladyslav Yerko and Kost' Lavro. Through these efforts the books of *A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA* have become an indispensible attribute of every cultured Ukrainian family and one of the most delightful cultural contributions by Ukrainian artists to an international readership. The demanding creative and production standards applied to its many prize-winning titles have attracted readers worldwide.

Among the publisher's most popular titles are: the *Mini-Wonder* book series (with a total print run of 1,600,000 copies), The ABC, *The 100 Fairy Tales* three-volume edition, the *Favorite Poems* two-volume edition, *The Snow Queen, Alice in Wonderland*, Harry Potter, Toreadors from Vasiukivka, Lisa and her Dreams, and The Night Before Christmas. A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA has held seven major exhibitions of illustrations to their books as well as a joint exhibition with British artists.

Artists in this exhibition representing *A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA* include Kateryna Shtanko, Kost' Lavro, Olech Petrenko-Zanevsky, Victor Garkusha, Valerie Sokolova and Vladyslav Yerko.

member of the Union of Artists of Ukraine, a laureate of Ukraine's Taras Shevchenko National Award, and the leading artist of A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA, Lavro and his creative path has been inextricably linked with the establishment and success of the publishing house. His now classic and beloved images of rabbits and cats have delighted hundreds of thousands of children. Lavro's books have been translated and published in the United States, France, Switzerland, and other countries and he is a regular contributor to Pomme d'Api, France's most popular children's publication.






Olech PETRENKO-ZANEVSKY UKRAINE




Kateryna SHTANKO UKRAINE

Vladyslav YERKO UKRAINE

V ladyslav Yerko's illustrations for The Snow Queen, The Tinderbox, Child Roland and Other Knight's Tales, The Tragedy of Hamlet, Prince of Denmark, Alice in Wonderland, and Gulliver's Travels have won global recognition. The internationally celebrated writer Paulo Coelho has called Yerko's The Snow Queen as "perhaps the most extraordinary children's book I have ever seen." The



rights to Yerko's books have been acquired by publishers in fifteen countries throughout the world—from the UK to South Korea and Australia.

Born in Kyiv in 1962, Yerko studied in the Faculty of Book Graphics at the Ivan Fedorov Polygraphic Institute in Kyiv from 1984 to 1990 and worked in film poster design. In 1987 he received an award at the Moscow International Poster Competition. In 1989 he started working in book graphics and illustrated the works of Hans Christian Andersen, William Shakespeare, Jonathan Swift, Lewis Carroll and others. Yerko—a laureate of the Lesia Ukrayinka Award, and winner of numerous other prestigious exhibitions, including "Man of Letters" when he was named best artist for 2002 by the Moscow Review of Books is today considered the leading Ukrainian maestro of book illustration.
