TOWN OF HAMPTON COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, STATE OF NEW YORK Local Law No. 1 of the Year 2017

A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING FOR THE INCREASE OF THE TERM OF OFFICE OF THE TOWN CLERK, TOWN TAX COLLECTOR, AND TOWN HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT, FROM TWO YEARS TO FOUR YEARS EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2018 SUBJECT TO MANDATORY REFERENDUM

Be it Enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Hampton, as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent

It is the intention of the Town Board of the Town of Hampton to increase the terms of office of the Town Clerk, Town Tax Collector and Town Highway Superintendent from two years to four years, as provided for in Section 24-a of the Town Law of the State of New York. Pursuant to and in accordance with Municipal Home Rule Law Section 10(1)(ii)(d)(3), the Town Board supersedes the requirement that this increase in terms be adopted by resolution at least 150 days before the biennial election and instead adopts said increases by this local law to be placed before the electors of the Town of Hampton at the next biennial election in November of 2017.

Section 2. Increase in Term of Office of Town Clerk, Town Tax Collector, and Town Superintendent of Highways.

Effective January 1, 2018, the term of office of the Town Clerk, Town Tax Collector and Town Highway Superintendent of the Town of Hampton shall be four (4) years.

Section 3. Mandatory Referendum; Effective Date.

This Local Law is subject to mandatory referendum according to the provisions of Section 23 of the Municipal Home Rule Law. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State and after approval of a majority of the electors voting thereon in accordance with the requirements of Section 23 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 4. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this Local Law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.
