At each Regional Meeting, RSAI Legislative Committee liaison(s) are elected by the members for the upcoming year. At the SE and NW Regional Meeting, there will also be an election for the RSAI Leadership Group representative, as these region's three-year term is up this year.

RSAI Annual Meeting: Save the date for the RSAI Annual Meeting, which will be held on Tuesday, October 17, 2023, at the FFA Enrichment Center in Ankeny. More details coming soon!

RSAI Legislative Update: Now that the second funnel is behind us, the House and Senate will concentrate on passing bills on their calendars. Work on Appropriations bills (including Education Appropriations) and property tax relief (if the House and Senate can come to agreement) will become the focus in this final month of the session. Per diem payments expire on April 28, but the Session could go longer. We hope not. Any bills that failed to survive the funnel get referred back to their committees for consideration next session. Thanks for your advocacy on SF 251 Administration Expenditure Limit of 5%. That bill did not advance in the House. Thank your representatives for listening.

RSAI priorities still on the table:

<u>SF 391</u> Governor's Changes to Chapter 12 Flexibility is on the Senate Calendar: ask Senators to refuse the House Changes and send the bill back to the House. There are many good things in that bill regarding district flexibility, offer and teach, and more local control. RSAI is registered in support. See the March 9 RSAI Weekly Report for details of the bill and the House Amendment.

<u>SF 496</u> Governors Transparency and Parents' Rights: House has a big amendment to be discussed on the floor. See the March 30 weekly report for lots of details. Our biggest concerns are

- 1) Change to the BOEE (5 parents, 5 educators and 1 school board member, which significantly alters the Board. Licensure boards are primarily made up of professionals with 1-2 public members.)
- 2) Temporary Initial Alternative License, an online educator license with no student teaching or practicum required, from HF 255, died in the Senate. RSAI opposed that bill.
- 3) Seizure action plans, which is an unfunded mandate and requires all staff to have Seizure detection and first aid training (let the health care trainings work group consider that before adding another training requirement)
- 4) Thank the House for striking the INS Civics test requirement for either reporting or graduation. Encourage senators to accept that change from the House.

<u>HF 604</u> <u>Disruptive Students and Ombudsman Complaints:</u> RSAI Is opposed to this one-size-fits all mandate for in school suspension for disruptive students. The Senate has promised to amend the bill. Encourage Senators to require school boards to have a policy, but don't dictate exactly what that policy must include.

<u>HF 256</u> Minimum Licensure Age and <u>HF 614</u> Licenses for educators from other states/countries: RSAI supports these two bills, both on the Senate Calendar.

<u>SF 392</u> Teach Iowa Scholar, BOEE Intern License, Management Levy for Teacher Recruitment and Retention. This bill is still in Senate Ways and Means. Although exempt from the funnel, it has a long way to go to get to enactment. Encourage Senators to get it moving.

<u>SF 390</u> Education Omnibus Clean-up Bill by IASB: modernizes processes, cleans up old language on SAVE and bonding, allows electronic notice, creates a task force to study mandated health trainings, and provides other flexibility options for school boards. On the Senate Calendar with HF 370 Companion. The Health Trainings Work Group from this bill has been amended on to SF 496.

<u>HF 459</u> Operational Sharing: restores original weightings plus increases the cap to 25 students. The bill is on the House Calendar and a Ways and Means bills, so exempt from the funnel deadline but has a long way to go. Encourage House members to move it forward. RSAI supports.

<u>SF 246</u> **Dropout Prevention Equity:** gradually increases the DoP capacity from the minimum of 2.5%, increasing by half a percent annually, until all districts are at the full 5% cap. The bill was approved unanimously by a subcommittee of the Senate Ways and Means Committee. Since it's a Ways and Means bill, it is exempt from funnel deadlines. RSAI is registered in support.
