

Further Description of Important Features (Continue on reverse if necessary) The original front-gabled, Cape Cod style house is dwarfed by the addition of an offset, front-gabled building constructed on the earlier street-side gable. The front gable of the newer section features pedimented hoodmolds trimmed with a central scroll over door and windows. Other features include a hipped-roofed porch, supported by chamfered columns in the "L" between the two sections; and frieze end and watertable boards on both sections.		26. 43. History and Significance The 1874 Atlas of Erie County shows a house at this site, on the George Kelley property. Oral tradition suggests that it was built by William Mootz in 1873, and the 1896 Atlas sites the owner as W.M. Mr. Mootz also owned property further north on this road, Division St., yet the Census records of 1870 and 1880 show him to be living on the south shore. He may		27. 42. (Cont'd) The original section has a shed-roofed addition that contains 6/6, double-hung windows and a newer shed-roofed addition crosses the north eave wall of the house. Windows are 2/2, double-hung, except for those noted.

have built it for one of his children that were of marriageable age at the time. In 1905 the house and the then larger lot was purchased by John Henry Hughes and his new bride, Laura Dischinger Hughes. They later sold the southern half of the lot to Daniel McGettigan (ERI-1575) for his home. Both John and Laura were born on the island, John to Michael and Mary Hughes, and Laura to Fred and Augusta Dischinger. John's first job, c.1890, was to manage the buffet and bar of George Schardt's New Island House hotel. After this burned he went to work for the KIL&T. Company's Cooper shop at the North Quarry (ER336). His daughter, Mary Augusta married Oscar McKillips, son of fishing "Boss" William Allen McKillips, and Louise Petterson, and made their home with her father in this house in which she still resides. Oscar was a carpenter working independently on house repair and remodeling. His workshop was (ERI-1626).
