#### The Archdeacon writes

#### Dear Friends,

No sooner are the Christmas decorations down on Twelfth Night (or Candlemas, depending on your practice) than the Easter Eggs start appearing in the shops – one of our modern signs of spring!

But we know that we don't just jump straight from Christmas to Easter. We shall begin to mark the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on 2<sup>nd</sup> March. In some traditions, last year's palm crosses will be burned, and the ash used to mark the forehead with a cross as a sign of penitence, focusing the heart on repentance and prayer, as well as on our own mortality –

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust, you will return."

For most people, modern Lent doesn't involve the full Lenten Fast. Instead, you'll often hear people talk about giving up chocolate, cake, alcohol, or social media. One year, in my teens, I gave up television for Lent. It was amazing to see what else I got done instead! The 'giving up' symbolises, of course, a period of self-denial: saying 'no' to some of the things we crave, to help us focus more on God. And in my book that's always a good thing. But just giving up things for the sake of it may not help us with that aim of focusing more on God and his character. Each year many Lent books are published to help us spend extra time reflecting on God and his character. This year's Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book, written by the Revd Dr Isabelle Hamley, focuses on justice as we recall the words of Isaiah, "Is this not the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice?" (Isaiah 58:6). There's a 40-day Live Lent challenge we can all follow, based on the book, which you can order online https://www.chpublishing.co.uk/books/9781781402603/live-lenthere: embracing-justice-adult-pack-of-10 (I've given the link for packs of 10 in case you want to follow the challenge as a congregation; you can order them individually or in packs of 50 as well.) There's also a children's version https://www.chpublishing.co.uk/books/9781781402665/live-lentembracing-justice-kids-pack-of-10

And in case you find the giving-up all too much, remember that the Sundays in Lent don't count as fast days: all Sundays are always a remembrance of the resurrection, and Christians can't fast on such a joyful day. You heard it here first...

Needless to say order sizes and therefore costs will vary between display areas, but contact with the nursery should resolve this situation.

In the case of larger displays from organisations which may require a visit from the nursery to establish needs and therefore prices, Morfe Valley Nursery is happy to undertake this should the need arise. A quote will then be given.

**PAYMENT...**Payment will be by invoice on delivery, then a statutary 28 days given for settlement.

#### THE RED , WHITE and BLUE flowers....

Morfe Valley Nursery have stressed that the logistics in this process have to be very carefully managed, from seeding, growing, calculating blooming etc. In order that the plants reach their destination so that their blooming is at its optimum for the Bank Holiday Weekend 2nd-5<sup>th</sup> June.

The Nursery has stated **the deadline for ordering** from them is **MARCH 31ST** During the weekend the Recreation Field will be open all day on Sunday June 5<sup>th</sup>. #### SEVERN VALLEY COUNTRY PARK

The work and support of Severn Valley Country Park Supporters Group is vital to the management of the park. The practical tasks they complete are invaluable. They also raise money through activities such as selling honey, making reindeer, their Christmas fayre and direct donations from visitors. The money raised is always used on different projects at the park and this month we have two examples of how the funds have been spent.

For over a decade we have had great success with kestrels nesting in a box which can be seen from the bridge. Recently, the box has been taken over by squirrels meaning the kestrels have not settled. This is unfortunate, as for at least five years in a row, the kestrels using the box raised numerous chicks. We would like the success with the kestrels to continue so our volunteers are using some funding to locate two new nesting boxes. One will be in a similar location by the bridge and the other will be close to our wildflower meadow. We hope this will encourage the kestrels to return. A local firm will be used to safely climb the chosen trees and fix the boxes.

Another way the funding has been spent recently has been to purchase a defibrillator which has been installed at the visitor centre. The defibrillator can be found on the outside of the centre, near to the Ranger's Office. It has been registered and is available for use.

We would like to thank our visitors for their kind donations, and we would also like to thank our volunteers who are always so generous with their expertise and time.

During March, the visitor centre and café will be open Wednesday to Sunday. Wednesday to Friday 11am-3pm, Saturday 9.30am-3.30pm and Sunday 10.30am-3.30pm.

Parkrun continues each Saturday morning, our Nordic Walking sessions continue on Wednesdays and we are in the process of organising a series of Woodland Mindfulness Workshops. Look out for more details on our Facebook page and webpage.


