Larry is one of our most active and best known lifetime members. In 2015 and 2022 he was voted "Rock hound of the Year" and has been the Show Chairman from 2019 through 2025. He has been club president three times, each term for two years. Additionally, he has been very active in the Northwest Federation of Mineralogical Societies (NFMS) and is our Federation Director since 2001.

Larry states his interest in rocks began as a child, searching for

agates in Lake Superior, Michigan. His interest in fossils extended to a geology degree in paleontology and at graduate school a major in mining engineering, where he was recruited to work at the Hanford Nuclear Reservation. Larry joined Lakeside in the early 90's when his two sons, Jason and Joshua, became interested in his mineral and fossil collection and joined the Junior Club. It wasn't long before Larry was a Junior Club leader and he soon became a leader in the adult club activities and has never quit his commitment to the club. He, his wife Kay and his sons traveled to many shows, adding to Larry's collection. He and his sons began competing in NMFS shows, displaying their fossils and minerals. Larry states his favorite rocks are fluorite and copper, and with his family he shares collections of fossils, thumbnail minerals and fluorescent and muscovite collections.

Larry would like to see more young people joining the club and that the club may someday have its own workshop. As he has lots of experience and expertise in display of minerals, fossils and jewelry as a Federation judge, he would like to see more members attempt to submit displays for award competitions. He knows the rules and can provide guidance for necessary skills, for entry and display improvements. Larry has made and continues to make significant contributions to club functions, and he acknowledges that he is ready for teach and share some of his club responsibilities with members willing to learn. Old Business

Show reports – attendance was down by about 400...suggested from the construction, so much else going on at the same time, competing show in Yakima. Discussed if the additional expense of the movers to assist on Sunday take down was of value and if we continue the practice, do we need 2 or 3? Apache Tears by Clair

Apache Tears are rounded pebbles of obsidian; they are usually dark colors like brown and black. Apache tears are found in the United States of America, in Arizona.

Wavellite by Callan

Wavellite was found in the year 1805 in Devon, England. It is commonly found in Arkansas hot springs, and also found in Germany, Brazil, Portugal, Russia, and a few other parts of the United States. It has a Mohs scale rating of 3.5 to 4.5. The color of wavellite can be green, yellow, white, and colorless. Wavellite gems are used in jewelry and art. Wavellite is made up of hydrated aluminum phosphate.

Apophyllite studies by Phoebe

Apophyllite is a calcium fluorite silicate mineral that has a high water content. It's usually found in Italy, Northern Ireland, The Faroe Islands, and Mexico. It can be grayish or white.
