


From Vicar Linneman...

The Wilderness of Judea: Temptation and Testing

I don't remember now who it was, whether a seminary professor of mine or a college professor, but I remember one of my instructors making the connection between the Israelites wandering in the wilderness for 40 years, and Jesus wandering in the wilderness for 40 days. And once I saw that, I remember having such an "Aha!" moment that I can still remember to this day what that was like. And so I pass this connection on to you, in the hope that it would illuminate your continued study of our savior Jesus Christ.


If you remember the wanderings in the wilderness in Exodus, Leviticus, and Numbers (and retold again by Moses in Deuteronomy), you will remember that the children of Israel after leaving Egypt wandered in the wilderness for 40 years after disobeying God's direction to go in and conquer the promised land. But remember what takes place before these wanderings? This, of course, is the central Gospel event in the Old Testament, the crossing of the Red Sea that culminates the entire exodus from Egypt of the children of Israel. The children of Israel passed through the sea on dry ground, while Pharaoh and his host were drowned at the bottom of the sea. God's people passed through the water, while God's enemies were destroyed.

Now the connection here to the life of Jesus is that before his own wilderness wanderings, he himself passed through the waters safely. Immediately before being driven out into the wilderness, he is baptized in the Jordan River by John. In both cases, God safely brings both Jesus and the individuals through the waters, and immediately they are both faced with the same temptations. Both Jesus and the Israelites are tempted with hunger, both Jesus and the Israelites are tempted to grumble against God and put him to the test. Both Jesus and

the Israelites are tempted to fall down and worship false gods. But only Jesus successfully resists each and every temptation. When the hunger tempted the Israelites, they grumbled against God saying, “Would that we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the meat pots and ate bread to the full, for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger” (Ex 16:3). Meanwhile, Jesus says “It is written, ‘Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God’ ” (Matt 4:4). When the Israelites were tempted to test God, they said, “Give us water to drink,” and Moses said to them, “Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the LORD?” (Ex 17:2). Meanwhile, Jesus says “It is written, ‘You shall not put the Lord your God to the test’ ” (Matt 4:7). And finally, when the Israelites were tempted to fall down and worship other gods, they almost immediately gave in and worshiped the golden calf (Ex 32). Meanwhile, Jesus says “For it is written, ‘You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve’ ” (Matt 4:10).

Jesus is the only Israelite to stand firm in the Word of God where every other Israelite failed. He shows that he indeed keeps the covenant made on Sinai, and he fulfills on behalf of Israel the Law and its requirements. And now he has set free all who are now grafted into God’s chosen people, you who have yourselves passed safely through the waters of baptism.
