
General Minutes

The regular monthly meeting of the GSSN was held at the American Legion in Henderson on Wed., July 7th, 2010. Ian called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm & he led the group in pledging allegiance to the flag. 37 signed in and there were 2 visitors. A few members had gone out to prospect but most everyone thought it was too hot. George Neidemeyer said he & John Bronstein had gone to the Johnny claim in Nye County. They found some "color" which was shown to the group. George spoke about this being a good place to check out. Dara then gave the Treasurer's Report (see attached). Ian then asked members to think about replacing Morris as Outings Chairman as well as someone to replace Dennis as Librarian. Ian told the group that equipment is available for members to use (e.g., dry washer, two metal detectors, etc.) & said that anyone interested could contact him until a new librarian is named. Avoid Snake Bites

- This is the first crucial step!
- Leave snakes alone (many people get bitten because they try to kill a snake or look closer at it)
- · Stay out of tall grass
- Keep hands and feet out of areas you cannot
- Be cautious when climbing rocks



When encountered

- Just walk around the snake
- Give about six feet of berth
- Remember a snake can strike half its length!
- If forced into killing a snake use a club, rod, or tool with a long handle that keeps you out of striking range.
 - Also the Taurus Judge is a good snake gun to carry when out in the desert.

Bitten

- 1. Get away from the snake to avoid a secondary bite
- 2. Identify or be able to describe the snake
- 3. Contact and transport victim to an emergency medical facility.
- 4. The number to call is 911
 - If you think your pet has been bitten by a snake, contact the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center 24hour hotline at 1-888-426-4435 and immediately transport to the nearest veterinary hospital.

Symptoms of Snakebites

- Dizziness, Fainting, Increased Thirst, Headache
- Blurriness
- Rapid pulse, Low blood pressure, Severe shock
- Convulsions, Loss of coordination, Weakness
- Nausea, Vomiting, Diarrhea
- · Fever, Severe Pain
- · Breathing difficulty
- Bleeding, Fang marks, Discoloration, Burning sensation, Swelling, Numbness, Tingling, Sweating



Steps NOT to take when bitten

- DO NOT cut or suck!
 - Cutting into the bite site can damage underlying organs, increase the risk of infection, and does NOT result in venom removal
- DO NOT use ice or hot packs
 - Ice does not deactivate the venom
- DO NOT use electrical shock
- DO NOT use alcohol
 - Alcohol is a vasodilator (makes blood vessels larger which increases venom absorption)
- · DO NOT use tourniquets.
 - Have not been proven effective and may result in limb loss.

Steps to take when bitten

- Use the affected limb as little as possible.
- Allow the bite to bleed freely for 15-30 sec.
- Cleanse and rapidly disinfect the area with Betadine or Alcohol pad.
- · Leave area of fang marks open.
- Strap gauze pad tightly in place with adhesive tap
- Overwrap dressing above and below the bite with an ACE bandage – wrap as tightly as one would a sprain
- Check for pulse above and below the bandage
- Keep extremity below heart level or in a gravity dependent position.

Emergency Snakebite Kit

- Snakebite kits can be prepared easily and relatively inexpensively. Start by obtaining a small canvas pouch such as those available in any army-navy surplus store. Include the following items:
- At least one roll each of 2" and 3" ACE or comparable elastic bandaging with clips.
- 2. sterile 4 x 4 surgical gauze pads.
- 3. A small bottle of Betadine solution.
- 4. One roll each of 1/2" and 1" surgical adhesive tape. (Do not use paper or clear plastic tape).
- Sawyer Extractors, or similar extractor devise. These devises are available in most camping gear, hunting/fishing or outdoors shops.
