

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, TOWN OF MARBLE, COLORADO, DECLARING AS A PUBLIC NUISANCE THE ACCUMULATION OF JUNK, REFUSE AND INOPERABLE VEHICLES WITHIN THE TOWN OF MARBLE, COLORADO.

WHEREAS, the Town of Marble is a statutory town organized pursuant to Colorado Law; C.R.S. §31-1-101 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Marble Board of Trustees finds that the accumulation of junk, refuse and inoperable vehicles within the Town constitutes a menace to public property, health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the Marble Board finds that the accumulation of junk, refuse and inoperable vehicles constitutes a nuisance to residents of the Town of Marble.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MARBLE COLORADO, ORDAINS THAT:

1. Definition: "Junk" means any manufactured goods, appliance, fixture, furniture, machinery, vehicle, personal property or any other thing or part thereof, whether of value or valueless, that is demolished, discarded, dismantled, partially dismantled, dilapidated or so worn, deteriorated or in a condition as to be generally unusable or inoperable in its existing state, which have been kept continuously for thirty days or more in such a manner as to be visible from any public right-of-way, whether situated upon public or private property. This shall include by way of illustration only and without limitation, paper, glass, bottles, rags, rubber, scrap metal, tin cans, scrap material, waste, concrete, rubble, boxes, crates, or machinery parts.

"Refuse" means waste, including garbage, attending or resulting from the occupancy of a residence or other place or dwelling, or from the operation of a business.

"Inoperable Vehicle" means any automobile, truck, tractor, motorcycle, or self-propelled vehicle which is in a condition of being junked, wrecked, wholly or partially dismantled, discarded, abandoned or unable to perform the functions or purpose for which it was originally constructed. The existence of any of the following conditions shall raise the presumption that a vehicle is inoperable: absence of an effective registration plate or safety sticker upon such vehicle; placement of the vehicle or parts thereof upon jacks, blocks, chains or other supports; absence of one (1) or more parts of the
