NOVA: Secrets in **Your Data**





Whether you're on social media or surfing the web, you're probably sharing more personal data than you realize. That can pose a risk to your privacy—even your safety. But at the same time, big datasets could lead to huge advances in fields like medicine. Join us on Wednesday, August 14, at 5:30 as we screen the documentary Secrets in Your Data on behalf of PBS station Nebraska Public Media.

Screening participants should come away from the 1-hour documentary with a greater understanding of what happens to our personal data online how it is used both to our detriment and to our benefit, and how citizens and communities can take steps to maintain their privacy online and move toward a less exploitative data future.

Data security is a global issue, but its effects are felt at the individual and community level, and we can all take steps to ensure our safety and security online. The screening will help participants connect with their community to discuss how daily life could be impacted by big data and data security, both positively and negatively. Hope you can join us!


Poet Julie S. Paschold Ages 15+

On Tuesday, August 27, at 5:30pm, author/photographer Jeff Barnes shares the images and stories of Nebraska's lesser known historical monuments, placed far off the beaten path. This is our state's "hidden history," with longforgotten stories and rarely seen landscapes, such as the impact of glaciers on our community monuments, or how Nebraska's first marker nearly went to the bottom of the Missouri and - once placed at its permanent site – still disappeared for fifty years. Wherever possible, markers of the host's community are also featured. Humanities Nebraska (HN) provides major funding for this program. HN receives support from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Nebraska State Legislature, the Nebraska Cultural Endowment, and private donations.




