



The Hungry in Clark County - 2021 COVID IMPACT

- The food bank has struggled in keeping the shelves full in 2020 and 2021. As food donations decreased the demand has increased. Healthy fresh foods are scarce. The foodbank is struggling to find healthy locally raised meat and produce.
- Additionally, restrictions of group events has led to reduction in food drives. Stay at home orders has reduced many volunteer hours and has eliminated many Seniors from volunteering. With the increased need for food assistance in the community, the need for volunteers remains high.
- In person distribution though the warehouse and food pantries have also been impacted. The food bank has introduced new no-contact distribution strategies to get food to the people who need it, including; drive through distribution, individual home delivery, and the building of specific food boxes for seniors, the homeless population, and children who aren't in school. The ability to provide more specialized food boxes is critical to make sure people who typically would come in and shop for what they need, still get the necessary food to keep them fed and healthy.
