What is the Nurturing Parenting Program?—The Nurturing Parenting Programs (NPP) are strength-based and designed to help families replace negative patterns with new, positive, nurturing patterns. When the following six protective factors are established in a family the likelihood of child abuse and neglect diminishes.

- 1. **Nurturing and Attachment**—parents learn about empathy and ways to develop an empathic relationship with their children.
- 2. **Parental Resilience**—parents will begin developing a positive self-worth and developing the skills to have a positive attitude and effectively solve problems and address challenges.
- 3. **Social Connections**—through group-based sessions, NPP promotes the development and strengthening of social connections.
- 4. **Knowledge of Parenting and Child Development**—helps parents understand age-appropriate developmental tasks and milestones of children,
- 5. **Concrete Support in Times of Need**—NPP provides a support system to ensure that families are the receiving the help they need within the community.
- 6, Social and Emotional Competence of Children-NPP looks at how to use "personal power" in a
