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Medical Information

Parents must notify the director/and or teachers regarding children who use an inhaler or who may require medications during their time at the Rachel Park Dance Center. It is also important to inform the director and/or teachers about your child's existing medical conditions or learning disabilities at the time of registration and throughout the school year. Our teachers are trained professionals who are anxious to work with all children and personalities, and the more we know about your child, the better the dance experience will be for all involved. All information about our students is confidential.

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Weather Cancellations

School closures due to severe weather conditions will be announced by 8am (for morning classes) and by 3pm (for afternoon & evening classes.) Notifications of weather cancellations will be emailed, posted on our Facebook page, and announced on the dance center's outgoing voicemail message.

Dress Code Requirements

The Rachel Park Dance Center maintains a dress code to encourage concentration and a sense of inclusiveness (variations in attire can be distracting and contribute to feelings of inequality). Uniformity in dancewear allows the teachers to assess how well the students are implementing the technique being taught, problems with alignment, and other important aspects of dance training.

- Students should carry their dancewear, shoes, and other belongings in a dance bag. Please print your child's name on all items.
- Watches, jewelry and baggy clothing should not be worn to class.
- Dance shoes should never be worn outside.
- Female students should wear their hair tightly secured in a neat bun for Ballet & a neat bun or ponytail for all other classes.

Tap	Black sweatpants or shorts, white T-shirt, black tap shoes.	Black leotard; pink or black tights; tan u-shell tap shoes (Primary-Int Level) black premium jazz/tap shoe (Jr-Sr Level)
Modern	Black sweatpants or shorts, white T-shirt, tan sole shields.	Black leotard, pink or black footless or convertible tights, tan sole shields.
Hip-Hop	Comfortable plain-colored clothing (t-shirts/sweats) and black sneakers.	Comfortable plain-colored clothing (t-shirts/tank tops/shorts/pants) and black glam pie glitter sneakers.
Acro	Fitted shirts and fitted shorts, bare feet.	Black leotard, pink or black footless tights or black bike shorts, bare feet.
Musical Theater	Black sweatpants or shorts, white t-shirt, black jazz shoes.	Black leotard, black or pink tights; suntan stretch jazz boots.
Lyrical	Black sweatpants or shorts, white t-shirt, tan foot undeez or sole shields.	Black leotard, black or pink footless or convertible tights, tan sole shields.



Registration Fee

An annual registration fee of \$30/student \$35/family reserves your spot in class and covers the cost of mailings, insurance, handbooks, rehearsals, and so on. Registration fees are not refundable, except in the case of preschool students who are determined to be unready for dance and may receive a credit for the following season. Registration fee and first month’s tuition is due at time of registration.

Tuition and Expense Policy

First month’s tuition is due at time of registration. Thereafter, full monthly tuition is due by the 15th of each month. We will accept cash, checks, or money orders for tuition payment. Please write your child’s name & class in the memo portion of the check. If you pay with cash, please ask for a receipt. Payments may also be made online via PayPal at app.thestudiodirector.com/rachelsdancers/portal.sd (5% processing fee will be assessed). You may also go to our website www.rachelparkdance.com. Go to the “enroll” page and click on “access your account”. Tuition payments made after the 15th of the month must include a \$15 late fee. If tuition is not paid by the 30th of the month, you may be asked to keep your child home until you are able to bring your account up to date. There will be a \$35 service charge for all returned checks and a \$10 service charge for any check re-deposited by the bank.

We offer a 5% discount on annual tuition that is paid in full by September 15, 2020. We also offer multiple class discounts (see below).

Please Note: tuition is based on the season regardless of how many weeks are in a month. Tuition payments average out to four classes each month. All tuition payments are nonrefundable.

Additional Fees

Tuition does not include the registration fee, dancewear, shoes, costumes, recital tights, recital tickets, recital DVD, private lessons, jackets or special events.

Discipline Policy

In order to maintain a happy, healthy, professional environment, students are taught the importance of being a part of the group. We encourage students to have respect for other students, the teachers and staff, and studio property, and we foster the development of good habits and compliance with rules of conduct.

Our staff and faculty are trained to use constructive techniques of discipline to maintain class control and handle individual misbehavior.

- Students who exhibit unacceptable behavior or attitudes are told what is wrong and directed to a positive alternative approach or behavior.
- If a student strikes another student, the two are respectfully separated and each is asked to explain what happened. They are then asked to help solve the problem, talk to each other, and reconcile with one another.
- Students who are disruptive will be respectfully asked to stop the behavior. If the behavior is repeated, they will be reminded of it and told how it affects others. If the disruption continues, the students involved will be asked to sit down for a short period of time (usually three to five minutes) before rejoining the class. If a student’s misbehavior continues to disrupt the class, the parent or guardian will be called to pick him/her up.

Termination of Enrollment

In certain circumstances, when it is in the best interest of one or more students, it may be necessary for the school owner/director to terminate a student’s enrollment. Every effort will be made to correct a problematic situation before terminating enrollment. Reasons for termination of enrollment include the following:



- Disruptive or dangerous behavior by students or their parents
- Abuse of other children, staff, or property
- Inability of the Rachel Park Dance Center to meet the child's needs

Attendance

All students are expected to attend their regularly scheduled classes. Each class offers a step forward in the educational process. A missed class could leave a child one step behind the other students. During the months of January through May, choreography for the recital will be taught and rehearsed. It is important for children to feel completely confident with the choreography and the year-end performance. Missing class during this period could result in frustration for the students and their teachers and classmates.

Tardiness

Dance is a physical activity that requires the body to be warmed up in order to execute movement safely. Late students miss the proper warm-up and/or barre and therefore may sustain injury. Students who arrive more than 10 minutes late may be asked to observe class for reasons of personal safety.

Class Visitors

Safety issues and legal responsibilities make it impossible for us to allow students to bring visitors into the classroom. Students should not invite siblings, other relatives, or friends to their classes.

Lost and Found

Please mark all dancewear, shoes, and personal items with your child's name. We will make every effort to locate and return lost items; however, we cannot be responsible for any items that your child brings to class.

Illness

Colds, flu, and other contagious diseases occur frequently and spread easily among children. To help protect your own child's health and to minimize the possibility of contagion, please keep your child at home.



If symptoms of illness deemed contagious are observed in your child during a class, you will be called to pick up your child immediately.

When your child has a fever, please keep him/her at home until the temperature returns to normal. If there are any lingering signs of illness, such as glassy or watery eyes, listlessness, and drowsiness, please keep your child at home. This will help to ensure that the illness has passed and that your child will be well enough to resume class activities the following week.

Parking Lot Safety

There is parking at the back of the Dance Center as well as limited curbside parking. Please use caution when entering and exiting the parking lot. Please do not allow children to play in or around parking areas. If you are parking at the curb outside the Dance Center please remember that it is illegal to park directly in front of the Dance Center, even if you are in your car. Police do take notice. Please do not park directly behind Lindo's Pizza. Those spaces are specifically reserved for them.

Student and Parent Use of Social Media

Use of Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, blogging, and other online social-media vehicles is commonplace. This policy is intended to provide the Rachel Park Dance Center students and parents with guidelines to eliminate any confusion concerning the use of social media.

- You DO NOT have permission to reveal any information that compromises the Rachel Park Dance Center. By that we mean you are forbidden to share personal information about the director, other students or their families, or anything that is proprietary and/or confidential to them or the Rachel Park Dance Center.
- Students and parents should neither claim nor imply that they are speaking on behalf of the Rachel Park Dance Center.
- Never post anything that could compromise the self-esteem of students who attend the Rachel Park Dance Center.
- If you post videos of class or rehearsals, don't post any choreography in its entirety; the Rachel Park Dance Center owns the copyright to all choreography taught at the school.



- Respect the law, including those laws governing defamation, discrimination, harassment, and copyright and fair use. As stated in this handbook, parents and students should never post negative comments about other schools or teachers. Also, please do not post negative comments about school activities such as competitions, conventions, and performances or about the directors of those events.
- Ensure that your social networking conduct is consistent with all of the policies contained in this handbook.

General Policies

- Parents and students should never interrupt a class in session.
- Only water is allowed in the studios. No food, drinks, or gum.
- No cell phones or other electronic devices may be used during class time. (This means no emailing, Internet use, or text messaging.)
- All students must show respect for their instructors, office staff and fellow students. Inappropriate behavior could result in dismissal from the dance center.
- **STUDENTS AND PARENTS ARE RESTRICTED FROM CONTACTING TEACHERS BY PHONE, EMAIL, TEXT MESSAGES, ETC.** All communication with teachers must go through the Rachel Park Dance Center office. Please direct all email correspondence to info@rachelparkdance.com



Annual Recital

Dress rehearsal: Saturday, May 22nd (*tentative date*)

Recital: Sunday, May 23rd (*tentative date*)

All students participate in our annual recital, which is to be held on Sunday, May 23rd (*tentative date*). Dress rehearsal is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, May 22nd (*tentative date*). Please note that all students must participate in the dress rehearsal in order to perform in the recital. There are no exceptions to this policy.

The recital offers our students a professionally directed performance that allows them to present to their families and friends the results of a year's hard work, dedication, and progress. Preschool students perform one time in the annual recital. All other students perform one time in each of the styles of dance they are registered for.

A big part of dance training includes learning through performance. Although performance opportunities can help prepare some students for a possible career in dance, they also contribute to children's success in non-dance activities. The experience helps build self-esteem and confidence, which can result in better in-school presentations, improved social skills, and strong college and job interview skills. The rehearsal process is a tremendous learning experience as well. It helps the children develop retention skills, and by working with their classmates on a group performance, they learn the positive aspects of working as a team to create the best result.

Recital Handbook

In April we distribute a recital handbook with all the information parents and students need to know to make the recital experience enjoyable for all.

Costumes

We spend many hours determining the correct costumes for each class. They are always age appropriate and of the highest quality possible. Preschool students will need one costume; all other students will need one costume for each dance form they train in.



Costumes include all accessories (hats, gloves, hairpieces, etc.), but do not include tights or shoes.

To ensure that costumes are delivered in time for school photographs and an organized distribution to our students, costume orders are placed during the December holiday break. Costume manufacturers do not accept cancellations or offer refunds; therefore, the dance center does not refund costume deposits.

Costumes will not be ordered until they are paid for in full. Parents or guardians accept full responsibility for all expenses, including surcharges and postage for costumes that are ordered late. A late fee of \$15 will be added to costume payments made after December 15th. The Rachel Park Dance Center is not responsible if costumes are not received in time for the recital due to late payments. Costume payments are the sole responsibility of the parent or guardian.

Recital Tickets

Tickets go on sale during the month of May. Tickets are general admission and the performance is reserved seating. **No refunds on recital tickets**

No one is admitted to the recital without a ticket. Infants and children who may have a hard time remaining seated during the entire performance should not attend.

Recital Photos

Junior, Senior Classes & all Competition Team photos will be taken during the month of May at the Rachel Park Dance Center. **Dates and times are subject to change.** Please confirm your child's time on the updated schedule to be distributed in early April. All students are required to be present for their class picture. There are no exceptions. **Pre-School, Primary, Elementary & Intermediate Level Class photos will be taken at dress rehearsal. Dates and times are subject to change.*



After the group photo shoot, students may choose to have solo portraits made in their costume. There is no obligation to purchase photos. Please arrive at least half an hour before your child’s scheduled time since photo shoots tend to run ahead of schedule.
