ATTENTION RIDERS!

Major construction projects will be underway during the next several months in the Chadwick Motorcycle and ATV Use Area.

Bridge construction for the trail relocation project started on September 27th. **Be Aware** that work will be carried out on trails 137, 124, 119 and 121. **Be Alert** for changes and construction activities.

Trail relocation will begin shortly on trails 138, 137, 113, 135, 129, 126, 130, 119, 121, 115, 124, 126, 126D and 101. Again, **please Be Alert** for construction activities.

The Cobb Ridge Campground expansion project began on September 27th. This project will double the size of the present campground, provide new toilets, electric hookups and eventually showers and flush toilets. Trail 117 will be impacted as it travels through the new campground. Please **Be Alert** when using this trail.

All of these improvements have been made possible by your fees paid through the Fee Demo Program.

On September 24, Mike Shown and Lee Glenn put on a qualifier style enduro at Collins, MO. They laid out an eighteen mile loop with 3 special tests. The start of each test was a known control. Which means you don't need to do any time keeping. Ride up to a check, wait until your minute comes up and ride as fast as you can to the end of the special test.

But the real racing started on Saturday with the kids' race. It was held on the grass track portion of the third special test. They divided the kids up into two groups by age. The older kids rode eight laps and the youngsters rode four. They all had a good time and received medals, just like the Olympics.

Since this race was only a half hour from my house, I worked this event. I was assigned to work the check at the end of the first special test. The weather at Collins was just the opposite of the last two Black Jack Enduros. Instead of being hot and dusty, it was cool and drizzly. Since it had been so dry, mud was not

The first and third special tests consisted of a combination of grass tracks and woods, while the middle test was mostly woods and included the infamous moon rocks.


Our sport experienced a dramatic loss on September 24 at the Cannon Creek Enduro in Collins, MO. Darrell Judy passed away from an apparent aneurysm during a special test about one mile from the end of the race. CPR was provided almost immediately by trained EMT personnel until an ambulance arrived.

Darrell was a key player in many aspects of off-road motorcycling. He was very involved in the Black Jack Enduro circuit, the Arkansas Hare Scrambles Series and the Arkansas State Trails Council. Darrell was a member of the Razorback Riders and knew the trails of White Rock National Forest better than anyone.

Darrell was 54 years old. Godspeed, Darrell.



Mel sold Colorado raffle ticks to try to win a Suzuki 4wheeler.


