DESCRIPTION: The 1961 Bear Polar was a step above, and priced 15% higher, than the 61 Bear Grizzly. The 61 Polar featured black and white tri-level fiberglass tip overlays and tri-level back overlays on a Bubinga riser. This bow had significant wear and tear and varnish loss to both the riser and the limbs, so I had to strip down the entire bow and re-stain and varnish it. Accordingly, I was not able to save the original logo and decal. The Polar logo on the limb is a reproduction sticker. The limbs were an impossible to match "Ice Blue" color, so I re-stained them brown. This bow has no delamination. There was a modest crack in the riser which was filled; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips or dings. No stress cracks or crazing. Overall, this is a really nice bow for its age. Because of the hairline riser crack and limb wear, I put the bow to a longer than usual stress test (held at full draw for 36 hours) to make sure the old glues still held and the bow didn't crack or "explode". Then taken to the range and test shot. The bow shoots really well. It is smooth and accurate. It Comes with a new rug rest and side plate as shown, and a new string.
