These young people have lived at Pleasant Hills since their early childhoods. One of the graduates said, "My family has experienced instability for years, but this stops with me! I am the first to graduate high school."

A Life Investment Fund provides for our students as they pursue their educations. This fund is possible by charitable gifts and assists with tuition, books, dorms, medical, clothing and transportation needs.

The building includes a welcome center and multiple resource rooms: toy room, linen closet, clothing and shoe closet, school supply room, processing room and rummage sale room.
