This was a "meet and greet" and a second meeting is scheduled for Feb. 2.</p> <p><u>Jessica/North</u>: Their meeting is scheduled for Jan. 22. Lisa & Kevin will report at Board meeting on Jan. 24</p> <p><u>Stefanie/South</u>: She met with chairs to discuss who to invite. Full team plans to meet at end of Jan.</p>
Events	Heather	2:00pm	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oregon Talent Summit – March 13-16th Oregon Talent Council has been dissolved and incorporated into the OWIB. They will have \$500K - \$2MM in grants to put toward innovative workforce solutions in Oregon. They are hoping for local board participation in this Summit. • Healthcare Apprenticeship – Mid February OWIB asked if we'd be interested in an apprenticeship program. Todd Nell will organize a Skype meeting to determine if there is sufficient interest statewide. • Re-entry Summit – TBD – Summer or Fall This summit will focus on engaging workforce and business in discussion of employing ex-offenders. Mark should be involved due to his experience in working with the prison population. He pointed out that we need to have the head of

			<p>the Dept. of Corrections involved or the initiative will go nowhere. The State will have a Kick-Off Summit in Salem in April. Stefanie attended this conference in the past and said it dispelled a lot of myths about risk, bonding, etc. for employers. ECWIB will pay for Mark and others to attend. Mark pointed out that it's important to make the business community feel comfortable with hiring ex-offenders and realize that they have resources. Training and hiring this population could be a partial solution to our labor shortage. (per Heather – we should involve Roger Lee and his assistant in the local summit.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working Together: The Future of Work – Fall Heather is on the planning committee for this conference that the OWP will hold in Eugene. It will be a day-long conference bringing together AOC (county administrators) who want to partner with Workforce. It will be similar to a TED conference. • Innovation Festival in Bend - June We are partnering with OSU Cascades, TAO, Opportunity Knocks. Event will have a statewide attendance. They still need sponsorship money.

It's getting more sophisticated and eventually will have comprehensive data that will be valuable to the Board. • Communications Update <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ State of the Workforce Report – discussed earlier. ○ Logo and name change Sublime feels we also need a tagline. Meeting about this Jan. 18. • Grant updates – Vets Jessica and Stefanie met with other partners and hope to submit an application by next Friday if we get enough info from the others. The grant is approx \$165K and will focus on removing barriers veterans have to reentering the workforce or moving up. • Other - Educator Externships Jessica spoke with High Desert ESD and Umpqua bank on a \$10K grant to pay teachers to develop a curriculum for teaching math in a work environment. Possibly will partner with Habitat for Humanity to use high school student to help

			<p>build a house and learn math principles on the job. This will give the students experience with work hours and CTE credits. We'll hear back mid-March.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Local area assessment – Wally and Steve Kramer received letter from the State Workforce Executive Team about the local area assessment conducted in Oct. 2017. The letter pointed out that assessment staff “observed a great deal of commitment, partnership, innovation and creativity that exists among Board staff and partners. These strengths will enable the Board to continue to leverage resources in a way that will really make a difference in the coordination, alignment and expansion of services in the entire ten county area.”
