



FLAMBOROUGH HEAD : The bevelled cliff to the west of north landing. The nearly horizontally bedded, resistant chalk forms a vertical cliff. The bedding planes and be clearly seen as well as vertical structural cracks (joints) and some minor faults. It is these weaknesses that the erosion waves wear away at the form the large natural arch and caves shown here.

Above the soft, unconsolidated boulder clay is subject to sub-aerial processes and forms a gentler slope to the upper cliff.
