DANIEL DAVIS, DPM, FAPWH is board Certified in Foot and Ankle Surgery by the American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgery® and board Certified by American Board of Podiatric Medicine. Dr. Davis has been in practice for over 30 years. Dr. Davis attended Bucknell University where he earned his B.S. in Biology and was a star athlete as part of the track team. He continued his education at the Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine (TUSPM), formerly the Pennsylvania College of Podiatric Medicine, earning his Doctorate in Podiatric Medicine in 1980. While at TUSPM Dr. Davis completed and finished the Penn relays marathon. He completed his residency at Parkview Hospital, where he was the chief resident. In 2017 Dr. Davis was awarded a Honorary Degree by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow. He is a also a fellow of the American college of foot and ankle surgeons and the American podiatric sports medicine association. Dr. Davis is certified in wound care and hyperbaric oxygen care by the National Wound Healing Association.

G. "DOCK" DOCKERY, DPM, FACFAS is a Fellow and Past Board of Director of the American College of Foot & Ankle Surgeons. He is a Fellow of the American Society of Foot & Ankle Dermatology, the American College of Podiatric Medicine and the American College of Foot and Ankle Pediatrics. Dr. Dockery is Board Certified in Foot and Ankle Surgery by the American Board of Foot & Ankle Surgery and is Board Certified in Podiatric Orthopedics by the American Board of Podiatric Medicine. He is a Distinguished Practitioner in the Podiatric Medicine and Surgery Division of the National Academies of Practice. He was voted "One of America's 175 Most Influential Podiatrist" of 2006 and voted as "Movers and Shakers: America's Most Influential Podiatrists" in 2012, by the Podiatry Management Magazine Editors & Advisors. He has published more than 152 scientific articles in peer-reviewed medical journals and he founded the International Foot & Ankle Foundation for Education and Research in 1979 and is currently the Chairman of the Board and the Director of Scientific Affairs of that organization.

ALLEN M. JACOBS, DPM, FAPWHc is in private practice in St. Louis, Missouri. He is board certified in reconstructive surgery of the foot and ankle by the American Board of Podiatric Surgery, and is a Fellow of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons. For 25 years, Dr. Jacobs served as a Director of Podiatric Surgical Residency Training; and has also served as a contributing editor to the Journal of Foot Surgery, Podiatry Today, Foot and Ankle Quarterly and Clinics in Podiatric Medicine and Surgery. Additionally, Dr. Jacobs has served as the Scientific Chairman of the American Podiatric Medical Association, The Missouri Podiatry Society, and on the Journal Management Committee of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgery. He has received numerous awards from the APMA and ACFAS for his dedication to podiatry and podiatric education, as well as recognition from the governors of Missouri, Arkansas and Massachusetts. He has published over 80 scientific articles in various publications and 17 chapter contributions in various textbooks, and has presented over 1000 papers at podiatric and medical society meetings. He is a nationally recognized author, researcher and a noted authority of surgery of the foot.

EDWARD S. GLASER, DPM is a dynamic lecturer and researcher in Foot Biomechanics. He studied mechanical engineering at SUNY Stonybrook and received his doctorate in podiatric medicine at the New York College of Podiatric Medicine. Although not a common path for a podiatrist, it turned out to be the right exposure for a future foot biomechanistic. Dr. Glaser developed a thriving practice over thirteen years and then chose to walk away from that success to challenge orthopedic conventions with his revolutionary MASS Posture Theory. 30 years and over a Million Pairs of Orthotics later, Dr. Glaser has made his life'smission a reality with Sole Supports: 'We make people better'.

STEVEN R. KRAVITZ, DPM, FAPWHc, FACFAS is a Diplomate of the American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgery and the American Board of Podiatric Medicine. He is also a Fellow of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons, and Certified in Wound Healing by the Council for Medical Education and Testing. He is the Founder and President of the Academy of Physicians in Wound Healing (APWH) and the Council for Medical Education and Testing (CMET). He is an Assistant Professor for the Advanced Wound Healing Center, Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine where he has served continuously as faculty for 35 years. He continues to do research and author multiple articles; he is an internationally known speaker on wound healing and related topics.
