Jorge Ameer
AMBASSADOR AWARD RECIPIENT:
FILMMAKER, DIRECTOR & PRODUCER

Jorge is a Panamanian author, director, film distributor and artist who from childhood participated in theatrical pieces, which engaged him in the world of entertainment. A human rights activist, Jorge has committed to creating controversial stories challenging audiences on stereotypical social conventions that detract from enhancing the global human experience.

At 18, he was selected to participate in the Walt Disney College Program, where he worked in the Department of Marketing for New Line Cinema, and as script analyst for Gere Productions. This immersed him in production, distribution, and purchase of foreign films imported to the United States and Latin America. Following graduation from the University of Texas Tech., he worked for the CBS global audience test pilots. This led to his own script writing, plus developing scripts for Paramount and Columbia Pictures Studios' affiliates. He performed in "Panther", "Tales from the Hood", "Social Friction Fables", "Friday", and co-starred in "Sabor Tropical".

In 1997, he founded and directed the Continental Film Festival in Contadora, the first American Independent Film Festival on an island. Then he created Hollywood Independents, thereby launching distribution of films with celebrities like Mario López, Jazmine Guy, Tyrone Power Jr., and countless others. Among his productions are: "The Singing Forest", "Contadora is for Lovers", "The House of Adam", and "Tropical flavor".

He's been instrumental in the Los Angeles Latino Film Festival and Methodfest Film Festival. Other than work featured in the G & L Film Festival in Barcelona and being cinema programmer for the G & L Film Festival in Palm Springs, he pioneered production and publishing of the award-winning "Guide to Gay & Lesbian Film".

Over the last 15 years he's accomplished these remarkable feats: founded the Glitter Awards; was invited by the Library of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts & Sciences Fairbanks Center for Motion Picture Study to avail his screenplays permanently in "The Core Collection"; started the "Jorge Ameer presents Independent Cinema Series"; and celebrated two premieres in the Cannes Film Festival ("Medusa" and "Find Pauletta"). He's filming the documentary "Classic Hollywood Cinemas" exploring their history. Recently, Jorge inaugurated the first Panamanian Program offering High School Degrees with emphasis in Film and Communication at the Instituto Panamericano (IPA), his alma mater in Panama.

Ambassador Award Recipient:

Actress, TV Host, model and Activist.

Patricia is a Panamanian actress whose career spans across English and Spanish markets. Among her credits are starring in the suspense film "Slammed", set for release later this year, which was directed by Trudy Sargent and presented at the Cannes Film Festival. She also stars in the comedic-drama "Confessions of a Womanizer" alongside Gary Busey and C. Thomas Howell. On television, Patricia will appear on a Latin American series named "Tómame o Déjame" featuring Maite Sambil, Scarlet Ortíz, Yul Burkle, Eduardo Serrano, Zully Montero, and Guido Massri.

Patricia has worked with highly regarded artists on films such as: "The Great Bake Off" (Denise Richards); "Your Move" (Robert Davi, Luis Gatica, Alain Mora); "Fighting For Freedom" (Bruce Dern, Kristanna Loken, José María Yazpik); "Light From The Darkroom" (Russell Wong); "Badass " (Ving Rhames, Danny Trejo, Ron Pearlman); "The Pool Boys" (Matthew Lillard, Efren Ramírez, Tom Arnold); "How the García Girls Spent Their Summer" (América Ferrera, Elizabeth Peña); "Spliter" (Edward James Olmos, María Conchita Alsonso); "Cloud Nine" (Burt Reynolds, DL

Hughley, Paul Rodríguez); and "All In" (Dominque Swain, Michael Madsen). Television appearances include: CBS' "NCIS," STARZ "Magic City," and "Grace" (Eric Roberts). Patricia became a fan-favorite on TNT's "Men of a Certain Age". She also guest starred on the FOX's "Ride Along." Patricia played 'Sofía Muñoz' on ABC's "Lincoln Heights." Some of her well-known telenovela works includes Univisión's "Corazón Apasionado"; as well as Telemundo's "Perro Amor" and "La Ruta Blanca".

Patricia, also a passionate animal rights activist, earned a place as spokesperson for PETA Latina. She did three previous campaigns for PETA, which included becoming the face of a worldwide Anti-Bull Fighting campaign. In 2015 she launched a cruelty-free signature line of lip products, Aniise by Patricia De León. Patricia launched her fourth PETA in Summer 2016.





Master Police Officer Vladimir Anderson

AMBASSADOR AWARD RECIPIENT: GUARDIAN OF LAW & ORDER.

Vladimir "Vlad" Antonio Anderson immigrated to the United States at age 9 along with his 4 siblings and parents Ana Amelia, a registered nurse, and Tomás Taylor, a marine mechanic. During seven years in the U.S. Marine Corps, he was assigned to units serving in different theaters and received military recognitions. Following military service he achieved his long life aspiration of becoming a police officer. In 26 years he has served in law enforcement with distinction and held positions as a background investigator, hostage negotiator, and in numerous other ancillary assignments. Currently, he is assigned to the Newport Beach Police Department's Detective Division, Special Victims Unit.

He serves as President of the Newport Beach Police Association; Director of the Newport Beach Police Charitable Foundation, a non-profit organization; and the Chair of NBPA Political Action Committee. Vladimir advises the 1st Battalion/1st Marine Foundation. Additionally, he belongs to the Orange County Police and Sherriff Association, the Police Officers Research Association of California, the American Legion and the Knights of Columbus.

His passion for supporting youth manifests in orchestrating funding to support the NBPA's community services. Among them are: the construction of a college center within a high school and provision of aid to at-risk-youth. He crafted the NBPA Scholarship Program for students seeking undergraduate degrees.

For the last 10 years, he's been overseeing the safety of students on school campuses. While he investigates incidents involving youth in the community, he upholds the relevance of reaching out to at-risk-students. His commitment to community is such that he selflessly provides his cellular phone number for general support, after-hours assistance, and directing youth to mental health services. Vladimir also works closely with school counselors, administrators, and psychologists to identify youth at risk to provide encouragement and guidance, instead of exposure to the criminal justice system.

AMBASSADOR AWARD RECIPIENT: NASA SCIENTIST, ACHIEVED SPACE ENGINEER & NATIONAL EXAMPLE OF LEADERSHIP.

Luis Rabelo received a dual Bachelor of Science in Electrical and Mechanical Engineering from the Technological University of Panama in 1983, an M.S. in Electrical Engineering from the Florida Institute of Technology in 1987, as well as an M.S. and Ph.D. in Systems Engineering from the University of Missouri in 1988 and 1990, respectively.

He was a Post-Doctoral Fellow in the Nuclear Engineering Department of the University of Missouri in 1991. Post-Doctoral experience also includes work in the field of Artificial Intelligence. He worked as Operations Manager for an engineering consortium.

Additionally, he taught at Ohio University as Associate Professor in the Department of Systems Engineering. His journey continued as a Senior R&D Engineer and Program Manager for the Advanced Technology Group of Goodrich in Ohio, with a focus on Aerospace projects.

Luis received a dual M.S. in Management and Aerospace from the Sloan School of Management and the School of Engineering at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Additionally, he was a Lead Scientist in the Honeywell Technology Center in Minnesota. He currently works as an Associate Professor at the University of Central Florida.

He is a NASA Fellow and NASA EPSCoR Project Manager at the John F. Kennedy Space Center in the Department of Industrial Engineering and Management Systems at the University of Central Florida. He has over 240 publications, 8 invention reports, three international patents, and graduated 14 Doctoral students as advisor. His career also includes work at Honeywell Laboratories, the National Institute of Standards and Technology, NASA, and MIT. Among the many awards received by him are ONE NASA for the best article of 2004 from the Society of Automotive Engineers, and Fulbright. He contributes as Board Member within several ventures in North America, Europe, Asia, and Latin America.







The Viva Panamá Organization was established in 1991 in San Fernando Valley when its director and family members realized that Panama's culture was not represented amongst the multicultural festivals in the Southern California area. Also, it was engendered by the intention to keep their children in contact with their culture. This led to the birth of its first project: "Ballet Folklórico Viva Panamá". Later, with the Consulate's help in spreading the word, a group of Panamanians started joining the group, which has over the years toured extensively. Locally, in more than sixty cities in California. At the national level, in Texas and Nevada. Internationally, this Ballet has visited Mexico, Puerto Rico, and Canada, exposing a wide variety of audiences to the picturesque and joyful traditions of Panamanian folk customs.


In April of 1999, VPO created "The Panamanian Cultural Arts Center" as a response to the need for more exposure to the Panamanian culture. The Center started coordinating displays and exhibitions, creating educational programs for museums, schools, universities, and other cultural centers. It also presented educational programs in elementary and high schools by teaching traditional dances from Panama.

In September of 2002, the official name of Viva Panamá Organization (VPO) merged from the fusion of these two first entities, as a way to provide a more comprehensive expression of the culture of Panama. VPO was incorporated on Aug. 3, 2012, in the state of California, and approved as a tax-exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code approved on Nov. 13, 2013. VPO's mission is to preserve, present and promote the many manifestations of the culture of Panama, through its music, dances, traditions, literature, paintings, arts & crafts, cuisine, its people, The mission is carried out by striving to provide the highest quality sample of the spirit and flavor of Panama to the multicultural population of California, and helping the socioeconomic development of Panama.

Since 2003, VPO sponsors another project called "Srta. Panamá California, which focuses on its youth by encouraging them to participate in sharing their culture and feel proud of their ancestry and heritage. The goal is to represent Panama in the different social, cultural events in the Los Angeles community. VPO has presented over time, 13 young ladies and guided them to represent Panama at a high level.

VPO has initiated a variety of cultural programs, including the "Ambassador Award" in 2011, recognizing the successes of notable Panamanians in all walks of American mainstream endeavors. VPO has paved the way for cultural exchanges between the U.S. and Panama, including the International Week of Panama in Los Angeles County in 2013. It has contributed in the inclusion of a Panamanian Band in the Rose Bowl Parade. In 2015. Also, VPO was finally able to create the "First Panamanian International Film Festival", codirected by the Panamanian Hollywood actor and director, Carlos Carrasco, in association with NewFilmmakers/LA and sponsored by Union Bank for two years. This year joining its Sponsor Team is the Panama Film Commission from the Ministry of Commerce and Industries of Panama. VPO keeps always dreaming because that's how its visions have become a reality. It always seeks to create new programs to accomplish presenting a float at the Rose Parade and the opening of the Panamanian Cultural Arts Center.
