This Sunday's Counsel

"Disciples of Christ are called to be the salt and the light of the earth"

YOUR ENEMIES

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THEME:

We are the salt and light of the earth when we show unconditional love and kindness to everyone.

WORD:

Disciples of Christ are called to be the salt and the light of the earth.

PROMISE:

"He redeems your life ... crowns you with kindness and compassion" (Ps. 103:4)

ORDER:

"You shall not bear hatred to your brother and sister." (Lev 19:17a)

DIRECTION:

Love and respect one another.

In the First Reading, God told Moses to speak to his people "Be holy, for I, the LORD your God am holy" (Lev 19;1-2).

This is God's command because the

Israelites were rebellious and fighting with each other.

Do not take revenge to your brother and sister. Love our neighbor as ourselves and not to hold grudge against one another. This command means for us to imitate Him and not to conform to the ways of the world. We should allow God to transform us internally and spiritually in order to be pure and holy so that we can enter the gates of Heaven.

God's most significant characteristic is holiness, it is the absence of sin and that is why God cannot tolerate sins. Holiness is not only separated from sin and worldliness, but also set apart for God's purposes. In order to become holy, you need a long process of sanctification.

God's destiny God's destiny for mankind is holiness and to produce saints. If we look at the face of a saint there is a certain aura that surrounds them and we can even feel that holiness radiating to us. We feel

reverence and respect. There is no holiness without obedience. Obedience leads to holiness. Being holy is showing God how much we love Him. Jesus is obedient unto death, suffered and died for us. In Christ we are already holy. We are so closely united with Jesus, that God sees us as clothed in the righteousness of Christ. As we become holy, we will naturally become more moral and being moral is about living in Christ. In Holiness we must allow the Holy Spirit to work in us.

Sanctification is by the Holy Spirit. The Spirit sets us apart in Christ so that we might be saved. The Spirit also exposes our sin so that we may recognize and turn away from it and helps us see the glory of God. (continued in page 2)

St. Catherine of Alexandria - Feastday November 25

Saint Catherine of Alexandria is a canonized saint in the Catholic Church, who was martyred around 305 in Alexandria, Egypt. She is recognized as the Great Martyr and Saint by the Orthodox Church. The young saint was born around 287 in

Alexandria, Egypt, one of the finest cities in the world, and a center of learning and culture as well as faith.



As a member of the nobility, she was also educated and was an avid scholar. Around the age of fourteen, she experienced a moving vision of Mary and the infant Jesus, and she decided to become a Christian. Catherine was arrested and scourged. Despite the torture, she did not abandon her faith. Word of her arrest and the power of her faith quickly spread and over 200 people visited her. The emperor's own wife, Valeria Maximilla was converted by Catherine. The emperor executed his own wife over her conversion. It is believed that Maximilla was alive and with her husband at the Battle of the Milvian Bridge in 312, seven years after the death of Catherine. One account claimed that angels took her body to Mt. Sinai. In the sixth century, the Emperor Justinian ordered a monastery established in her name. The monastery, Saint Catherine's, remains to this day and is one of the oldest in the world.

Around the year 800, a legend spread that her body has been found with her hair still growing and a constant stream of oil coming from her body. Nothing exists to this day of her remains, and her very existence has been called into question.
