WEEKLY THOUGHTS 16th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JULY 20th 2025.

Dear friends, welcome to the celebration of the 16th Sunday in Ordinary time. The first Reading of this Sunday; Genesis 18:1-10 speaks of Abraham's hospitality to the three strangers and was promised a son to be born by Sarah.

In the Second Reading Colossians 1: 24-28 speaks of the mysteries hidden from ages being revealed in Christ. Jesus still reveals the mysteries of the Kingdom of God to the childlike or little ones because of their humility, faith and trust in God. This is contrary to the wise, educated and scribes. They are proud and not willing to listen nor take the message of Jesus.

In the gospel Reading of last Sunday, we heard Jesus responding to the two questions asked by the scribe: the greatest commandment. Jesus responded, love God and your neighbor with all your heart, mind, and soul. "To who is my neighbor?" Jesus responded with a parable of a good Samaritan who gave help to a certain man who fell a victim to the brigands and left him half dead. Among the three passersby, the Samaritan stopped to help the injured victim and a Jew.

The Good Samaritan is a typical example of a disciple of Jesus who must see and act without any racial bias or inclination. People should be helped not based on race or religion but simply because they are human beings created in the image of God.

The story of Jesus' visit to the two sisters Mary and Martha in today's Gospel (Luke: 10: 38-42) speaks of the dynamic of Martha rush to get the food at the table. Mary chose to sit at the feet of Jesus listening to Jesus. Jesus responds to Martha's complaint that she asks Jesus to let Mary help with setting up the table. Jesus responds to Martha that Mary has chosen the better part of sitting at his feet listening to Him. Jesus does not condemn Martha's hospitality but commends Mary's spiritual choice of listening and learning at the feet of Jesus.

Jesus invites us daily. "Come to me all who labor and burdened and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me for I am meek and humble of heart, and you will find rest for yourselves." (Mat 11: 28-29)


For a woman to sit and learn at the feet of Jesus was a cultural revolution introduced by Jesus. Social and cultural boundaries confined women to certain limits. The kingdom and reign of God, Jesus promulgated was inclusive to all cultures and had no restrictions to social codes or boundaries.
