Aloha Kakou,

These are turbulent times. We are swimming in stories and living in languages that are religious, psychological, cultural, and social all mixed together. And political. Yes, that, too. As this last week in September has so ably demonstrated to us. And we are divided. I want to stay away from politics because it has become so divisive, but how can I? Problems, plans, solutions - it seems that everything, religious as well as secular, has become politicized these past few years – or decades. Conflicted, at the very least.

Our life together has become intertwined in ways that we cannot seem to "untwine." The origins of these challenges seem mysterious. There are many stakeholders in how the problem is diagnosed as well as "solved." Every solution seems to bring new problems. There appear to be no right answers.

That could get us very discouraged, especially if we are looking for any sort of endpoint, a final fix, if you will. Well, the fix is in and it's not turning out too well. I see people all around me losing heart, getting cynical and retreating from public life and social problems to the privacy of their jobs, homes and family. "How," they ask me, "do we keep what matters most to us from unraveling?"

How indeed. A good question. How do we keep our lives and families from unraveling, while untangling the wicked problems that beset our public lives and world, including our congregations? How do we keep our faith alive?

These have been called "Wicked Problems" by a sociologist, Horst Rittel, who wrote about them in the 1990s and whose thinking I find intriguing. By "wicked" he does not mean evil in a moral sense but mind-boggling difficult to sort out, nearly impossible to solve. Like "wicked vicious circles." It's comforting to know that someone has been thinking about what I've been wondering about a lot longer than I have and has put a name to it. That gives me some sense of hope.

It also reminds me that Martin Luther talked about the "Church-Always-Reforming, the Church always on the way, shaping and being shaped by the ways of the world and the ways of the Spirit at the same time. While we don't have to solve all our problems, we do need to develop what another thinker I admire called a "poised resourcefulness," with which to find our way about amongst these wicked problems.

We Christians might describe this resourcefulness as "discipleship." An ability to focus on the story and language of God in Christ, redeeming our world, untangling the wicked problem of sin, death and evil. What I might also call "taking up our Cross and following Jesus."

A comforting thought in challenging times. I hope. Crosses, we confess, do lead to resurrections.
