- We will have a combined summer worship with other Hillsboro area churches here at Calvary on August 31st. Potluck to follow—of course!




Robert Hoge's memoir covers his first fourteen years growing up with massive birth defects and surgeries. It is hailed as a triumph of spirit. The public library has 13 books, 5 eBooks, and 1 audiobook CD set.

The Red Pencil explores conflict and resilience through the eyes of a twelve-year-old girl from a destroyed village during the Darfur conflict. She aspires to go to school in the refugee camp and finds relief through her art and the friendship of a wise elder. The public library has 12 books, 10 eBooks, and 8 downloadable audiobooks.

Coming July 22--A Gentleman in Moscow by Amor Towles, 2016

This historical fiction selection follows a Russian aristocrat who is sentenced to house arrest in a luxurious hotel after the Bolshevik Revolution in 1922. He spends three decades in the hotel, navigating the tumultuous political and social changes of Stalinist Russia while also developing friendships, relationships, and a sense of purpose within his confined environment.


