Tannenbaum Forest Opens Thanksgiving Friday

Is it possible? Yes, Prelude to Christmas Tannenbaum Forest opens Friday, Nov. 28 and boy, are we excited to see what our friends and neighbors have dreamed up for this annual enchanted forest of Christmass trees at the Festhalle.

Decorating will begin Monday, Nov. 24 from 11 a.m. until 8 p.m. and continue Tuesday, Nov. 25 from 9 am. until 5 p.m. but yes, many volunteers have already spent hours planning their trees and making or obtaining their decorations.

The forest will be open Friday, Saturday and Sunday - Nov. 28 through Dec. 21. Santa hours have been posted and include Saturday Nov. 29 from 11 - 4. For a full list of all the hours Santa will be in the forest go to the Amanacolony.com website.

Prelude to Christmas was Born 40 Years Ago

From 1980-1986 while the Amana Colonies were tapped to host both the World Ag Expo and then the Farm Progress Show, week-long September agricultural events that drew up to 40,000 people each day, Oktoberfest stopped. No more parades. No more music.

In the post Oktoberfest hush, Emaline Bendorf owner - creator of the Cellar Door Gift Shop, and a few of her friends got to thinking; What if they could create a Christmas event that would celebrate Amana's communal heritage?

So Prelude to Christmas was born; the angelic dream child of Emaline Bendorf, Elsie Oehler and Terry Roemig, three very creative and well-organized women, who wanted to share an Amana Christmas with visitors. They enlisted help from the Amana Heritage Museum staffers and all Amana merchants and held the first meetings in Bendorf's home. Tom Burgher and Don Krauss both recall the meeting to discuss the new idea for a holiday festival. "I remember thinking this could be really nice," said Don Krauss, Village Winery.

Caroline Ertz, Mary Burgher and Barbara Hoehnle created a 40- minute program, A Glimpse of Amana Christmas Past for the Amana Heritage Museum. Hoehnle researched and wrote the parts performed by volunteers. Ertz and Burgher sang and recited verse with "Captain" Ken Denzin, Betty Parvin, Nola Moser, Liesel Burgher Yunek, Erin Moser, Barbara, Peter and Charlie Hoehnle, Stuart Wendler and others taking part. Amana Society had a brilliant idea. She had been the highly successful organizer of several Oktober-fests and new the ropes. When she told Christmas shop owner, Tim Meyer (owner of Tiny Tim's Christmas Room) and Barb Buchanan (owner of Thimbleberry at Old Wine Cellar) they agreed. "I thought, around here everyone loves going to the forest in the fall, why not bring the forest to the Festhalle and decorate it for Christmas." Hol-lrah explained. That's how Tannenbaum Forest came to be added to Amana's Prelude to Christmas and that's how Pre-lude became Amana's second largest annual event. Terry Roemig and Allyn Neubauer both contributed their creative touches to the new Forest. Neubauer enlisted furniture makers from the Amana Furniture and Clock Shop along with woodworkers Lee Herr, Lial Selzer, Ray Berger, Leroy Graesser and Har-vey Jeck to build a 17-foot- tall wooden Christmas pyramid. Roemig decorated it top to bottom creating Santa's workshop and scenes from the North Pole. "It was, well it is, beautiful. The forest is just magi-cal. I love it and I think everyone who sees it loves it," said Hollrah. That first year Tim Meyer donated a European-made Nativity scene. The Harold Schuerer family contributed their sleigh for Santa to sit in when he greets kids at the forest. Now Prelude to Christmas and the Tannenbaum Forest are a highlight of the year, attracting thou-sands of people who make it a part of their own fam-ily holiday traditions. In 2024 despite an ice storm that forced the closure of the forest one Saturday during its run, 16,247 people visited the forest. In 2023 we had 18,528 people see the forest. Hope, light and the joy of Christmas shared with thousands – that's our 40 year old community tradition.

vignettes it told of a communal Amana Christmas Eve. The show, or a version of it, was presented at ev-ery Prelude to Christmas for over 20 years. Thus the line uttered after the Weihnachtsbaum is decorated, "It was the prettiest tree we've ever had!" included in twenty years of museum performances found its way into the hearts of many who loved A Glimpse of Amana Christmas Past. Advertised to the general public for the first time in 1985, Prelude to Christmas offered evening events and evening shopping. Candle votives in small pa-per sacks (stabilized with sand) lined Amana's side-walks for shoppers. The restaurants offered specials and the shops stayed open till 9 p.m. Christmas car-olers went door to door ending up at Zum Burghof for a hot toddy. The celebration grew as the Old Creamery The-atre Co. showcased a holiday production at their new theatre. Then Tom Johnson produced what became favorite here, yes, of course it was the Dickens clas-sic, "A Christmas Carol," which always featured local children in the cast. In 1991 the Amana Church held the first cookie walk. An event that soon gained a huge following and has managed to be just as dazzling each of the past 33 years. The first cookie walk committee in-cluded Melissa Schuerer, Carol Zuber, Linda Setzer, Mary Burgher and Katy Berger, we have heard, but we haven't found a complete record of that first com-mittee so most likely others were involved too. It was a novel concept and one every baker in Amana could get behind. In 1999 when the Festhalle barn expanded the po-tential for weatherproof events, Susan Hollrah of the
