Subj: Unfinished Business to Reduce DoD Wasteful Spending and Inefficiencies, Vs. 2

Dear Hon. Representative Grothman:

I am pleased that you joined the Congressional DOGE Caucus. Please bring to the Caucus my proposed solutions for what you stated are “large, systemic issues that allow waste and inefficiencies to persist” and my recommendations to modernize defense bureaucracy and tools for the information age where urgency, flexibility, transparency, and action are the watchwords. I first discussed this in my letter to you dated July 28, 2024.

Your Issue

One of your issues is program managers do not “have the proper authority and resources needed to effectively manage these programs and make necessary changes as problems arise.” I agree.

I addressed that issue in letters to my representative, then Chairman Henry Waxman, dated 6/22/2007 and 3/10/2008. I also supported John McCain’s oversight and acquisition reforms regarding the issue during 2011-18. Then and now, the root cause is the contractors’ misuse of the ineffective DFARS Earned Value Management System (EVMS) clause. Excerpts from the Waxman letters:

Some defense contracts have misused incentives that were tied to achieving contractually required reports of cost and schedule performance, called EVM reports.... the use of these incentives poses a risk that the contractors might sacrifice providing objective program status reporting in favor of “making the number” and that they may “manage data and reports.”

Both DoD and the U.S, Navy issued policy memoranda which disclose that EVM is not working for acquisition management. The DoD memorandum states that:

- EVM is not serving its intended function in the internal control process.
- DoD is committed to resolve systemic, DoD-wide weaknesses.

An update to that issue is my white paper, *Common Sense Project Management: "When you come to a fork in the road..."* 1/16/25

Other Issues Raised at the July Hearing

Eaglen:

1. Modernizing defense bureaucracy...for the information age where urgency, flexibility, transparency, and action are the watchwords.
2. Reform through reduction rather than the addition of new laws and rules.

Schwartz:

1. Overregulation...companies...spend money on compliance instead of on what that really matters. This dissuades some companies from working with DoD and squanders limited resources.
2. DoD's IT and business systems are hampering its ability to leverage data and need to be modernized.

Congressional DOGE Caucus Platform

My solutions also address the following elements of the Congressional DOGE Platform:

- Government agencies, programs, rules, regulations, and employees must demonstrate effectiveness for and responsiveness to taxpayers while also not creating unnecessary costs or burdens.
- Existing federal agencies, programs, rules, regulations, or functions that do not provide value to taxpayers must be reformed or eliminated.
