This Month in History


June 5, 1783 - The first sustained flight occurred as a hot-air balloon was launched at Annonay, France, by brothers Joseph and Jacques Montgolfier. Their 33-foot-diameter globe aerostatique ascended about 6,000 feet. In September, they repeated the experiment for King Louis XVI, using a sheep, rooster and duck as the balloon's passengers.

Birthday - American patriot Nathan Hale (1755-1776) was born in Coventry, Connecticut. During the American Revolution, he volunteered for a dangerous spy mission in Long Island and was captured by the British on the night of September 21, 1776. Brought before British General William Howe, Hale admitted he was an American officer. Howe ordered him to be hanged the following morning. As Hale mounted the gallows he uttered, "I only regret that I have but one life to lose for my country."

June 10, 1652 - In Massachusetts, silversmith John Hull opened the first mint in America, in defiance of English colonial law. The first coin issued was the Pine Tree Shilling, designed by Hull.

Birthday - American musician Mildred J. Hill (1859-1916) was born in Louisville, Kentucky. She composed the melody for what is now the world's most often sung song, *Happy Birthday to You*.



Special Report From Bobby Stout

Lone Star Corvette Club Classic Car Show - a BIG THANK YOU to everyone that helped out at Texas Motor Speedway on the 20th of May. It was a GREAT day, and as Carolyn once told me but after we had been married for almost forty years..."I have never seen a Corvette that I did not like, and yes, there are some that I like more, but I like ALL of them." Guess that is why we have had Mustangs in our garages since 1968...OH well, I tired. Again, thank you to everyone that came out and if you did not, you missed a really cool car show - nothing but Corvettes under the Front Straight grandstands from end to end.

NSRA - Mid-America Nationals - Wonderful trip to beautiful Springfield, MO. Started out Sunday with a side trip to the Beaver's Bend Car Show in Broken Bow, Oklahoma. We did not make the car show (just too tired from Friday and Saturday's CCC activities), but did make lunch in Broken Bow at a five-star rated (reviewed) Italian restaurant. Travelled on to southern Missouri. Our plans were to spend the week in Branson in preparation of the NSRA Mid-America Nationals in Springfield, MO before Memorial Day. Planned to do a few shows in Branson. Had lunch at Lambert's (Home of the Thrown Rolls) in Ozark on Monday. Carolyn spent the week roaming the shopping areas of Branson, but no theatre shows. I missed most all of the week, as I had a crisis in the office and flew back on Tuesday night and returned to Springfield on Friday night. Dinner on Friday with long-time friends and then the traditional drive through the National Cemetery. Established in 1867 as a place to inter only Civil War Confederate soldiers, many of whom died at the Battle of Wilson Creek. It has since been expanded and opened to all veterans. Springfield National Cemetery now has the interred remains of soldiers from wars dating back to the Revolutionary War.. We began the day Saturday enjoying the absolutely beautiful weather, friends, a bag of kettle corn, and the cars and trucks on the Ozark Empire Fair Grounds. Visited both the Vendor and Women's World areas. Did my thing in the STREETSCENE booth for a couple of hours at noon. Then the fun began... The weatherman was predicting baseball to grapefruit size hail for the early evening hours. Praise the Lord, the large hail never came to Springfield. There was a tornado on the ground in Lebanon (25 miles NE of Springfield). We had scouted out the parking garages downtown on Friday night, so that we would have an emergency plan. Well, we took a parking place on the second floor of a parking garage just before 3:00 p.m. and we stayed there until after 10:00 p.m. before driving very slowly back down to Branson (the storm was still in Branson). By the grace of God and stopping to check radar frequently, we avoided any damage to the vehicle. We were weary from sitting in a beautiful, picturesque parking garage for over seven hours at one of the downtown Missouri State University buildings. We ate tuna salad and crackers and then later in the evening, we had crackers with tuna salad.

Sunday morning brought blue skies and sunshine and the road home. We travelled the scenic route through Shepard of the Hills, Table Rock Lake, Eureka Springs, and Rogers, AR, all before we shifted out of low gear (translation...we were not in a hurry and took our time). We were happy to get home before midnight and very thankful for a garage in which to park our car. But I will assure you that we are both looking forward to the trip next year on May 24-27, 2018!! ...will you plan to go with us?? 
We could discuss this at the meeting and possibly pick a date for the cruise. Let me know what you think.



Recipe Corner

Ingredients

- •4 center-cut bacon slices
- •3 tablespoons canola mayonnaise
- •1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- •8 (1-ounce) slices whole-grain or whole-wheat bread
- •8 ounces unsalted sliced deli turkey (such as Boar's Head)
- •8 (1/8-inch-thick) slices tart apple (such as Granny Smith)
- •4 (1-ounce) slices reduced-fat colby-Jack cheese
- Cooking spray

How to Make It

- 1. Preheat a waffle iron with 4 compartments to HIGH.
- 2.Place a paper towel on a microwave-safe plate. Arrange bacon on paper towel; cover with an additional paper towel. Microwave bacon at HIGH for 4 minutes or until done.
- 3.Combine mayonnaise and mustard in a small bowl. Spread about 1 1/4 teaspoons mayonnaise mixture over each bread slice. Divide bacon, turkey, apple slices, and cheese evenly among 4 bread slices; top with remaining bread slices, spread side down. Lightly coat both sides of sandwiches with cooking spray. Place 1 sandwich in each compartment of waffle iron; close waffle iron firmly on sandwiches. Place a heavy skillet on top of waffle iron to help flatten sandwiches evenly. Cook 3 to 4 minutes or until golden brown and cheese melts.
