ASSET PROTECTION LIST

In order to properly advise you in your estate planning and asset protection, the following documents would be helpful for our discussion:

Income/Medical Expenses/Gifts:

1. Verification of income from any source including: Social Security, Retirement/Pension, Annuities, Earned Income (from employment), Rental Income, etc.

(Social Security benefit letter can be obtained online at www.ssa.gov or by calling 1-800-772-1213)

- 2. Verification of health insurance premiums paid; (Medicare supplement premiums can sometimes be found at https://www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan/enrollment/check-enrollment.aspx)
- 3. Most current tax return.

Resources/Assets/Gifts:

- 4. Resource verifications: bring the most recent statement for each account (past 3 months' stmts. if applying for Medicaid)
 - o Bank Accounts,

o Retirement Accounts,

o CDs.

o Stocks,

o Brokerage/Investment Accounts,

- o Bonds,
- o Life Insurance Policies including recent cash surrender values and death benefit;
- Annuity statements and, if possible, the policies;
- o Certificate of Title for vehicles, mileage and model of vehicles;
- o Deeds to any real property owned, property tax statements, and (if married) homeowner's insurance;
- o Prepaid funeral documents (if funded by a life insurance policy, need the death benefit of the policy and proof of irrevocable assignment to the funeral home) and cemetery plot;
- Statements for any other assets
- 5. Verification of any gifts made within the last 5 years.
- 6. Long Term Care Insurance Policy

Legal Documents/Disability

- 7. Legal documents, i.e., Power of Attorney, Trusts, Wills
- 8. Any trust where funds are held for your benefit
- 9. Disability papers if anyone in immediate family (spouse or children) is disabled.

General Documents Used for Medicaid or Veteran's Benefits Applications:

- 10. Birth certificate and Driver's License or State ID;
- 11. Proof of Marital Status:
- a. If Married: Marriage Certificate, Marriage License,
- b. If Single or Widowed: Spouse's Death Certificate or Divorce Decree;
- 12. Social Security card, Medicare card, health insurance Supplemental cards;
- 13. Military Discharge Paperwork or DD214 for yourself or deceased spouse;

It would be very helpful if you could bring these items in the order of the list for ease in copying and to expedite a quicker process in preparing for your consultation.
