

Having had the flu this past week, I got a chance to do some more work on devotional reading and bible study. Being in God's word is a breath of fresh air; it brought life even on days when I didn't feel very alive.

The annual meeting is behind us now and Lent is coming right up. I for one am looking forward to seeing what this new year offers, and I'm excited to share some amazing Lenten meals with Faith and St. Mark's in the months ahead.

One of the things I was meditating on during my recovery was a passage of scripture we all know very well... Psalm 23. When I think about that verse at different times I see different things. 


