Ordinance O-2019-17

**AN ORDINANCE HIRING SYDNEY DOUGHMAN AS A FULL TIME POLICE OFFICER
FOR AMELIA VILLAGE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, The Mayor of Amelia Village after conferring with the Police Chief, has recommended the hiring of Sydney Doughman as a full time police officer for Amelia Village, and;

WHEREAS, The Council of Amelia Village concurs in the appointment of Sydney Doughman as a full time Amelia police officer.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio, that;

SECTION I. Sydney Doughman is hereby employed as a full time police officer of Amelia Village, effective April 29, 2019 at a starting salary of \$17.54 per hour.

SECTION II. This appointment is contingent upon Ms. Doughman passing pre-employment medical and/or psychological examinations and drug screening to ensure that Ms. Doughman is physically and mentally able to perform the duties of police officer.

SECTION III. Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION IV. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the Village. The reason for such necessity is that the Police Department of Amelia Village has recently lost several police officers and this appointment will allow the Village to provide the necessary police protection to the citizens of the Village. Therefore, provided this emergency clause receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

MR. FISCHER moved to suspend the rules requiring two readings on two separate dates.

MR. STORM seconded the motion.
