BACK TO SCHOOL DATES



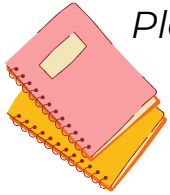
It's that time of year again! Here are the back to school dates for our neighborhood.

What is a Soberliving Home?

We recently received a suggestion in the drop box at the community stand asking if Patrick could help demystify his practice and share more about what he does in Coronado Hills. The following is a condensed message from Patrick himself. We encourage folks to take the neighborhood survey with more feedback & requests like this!

Hensley House is a sober living home for men in recovery from addiction, offering more than just sober housing—it's a structured, supportive environment focused on accountability, integrity, and purpose. Most residents come directly from treatment and commit to curfews, chores, full-time work or school, regular drug testing, and active 12-step participation.

As the highest-rated sober living home in Texas, Hensley House maintains high standards and a strong sense of community. Residents strive to become better men and neighbors through service and connection, regularly volunteering in local projects like clean-ups, food drives, and Habitat for Humanity builds. Sober living homes are protected under the Fair Housing Act and the ADA, affirming the right of people in recovery to live in residential neighborhoods. At Hensley House, we honor that right with structure, respect, and a commitment to giving back.
