She said they provide Mental Health services and Substance abuse help. She said she would like to see a Crisis Stablization Unite in Region I. Jennifer Kriha said she is the Fiscal Director and takes care of budgets and makes sure programs get paid for those in need. She said their funding was cut from \$5.9 million to \$4.5 million because of the state.

Loretta McCoy, County Treasurer, presented a resolution to transfer \$50,000 into the Road Fund. Motion was made by Schmidt, seconded by Batterman, to approve the transfer and to adopt the following resolution:

Paul Strommen, Candidate for Legislative District #47, met with the Board, to introduce himself and to talk about the Legislature and what he is planning on doing if elected. He talked about big and small businesses, the oil and gas industry, pipelines and the financial benefit to the state. Metz asked about renewable energy, solar and wind energy. Stromman said he has a meeting tomorrow with public power districts. He said they are capping and plugging oil and gas lines. He said decommissioning them is too costly for the landowners. He discussed renewable energy. Metz said we wants new businesses to

come to Morrill County, but does not want what happened in Cherry County to happen here. LB 34 was discussed. Metz said education is the main place where our tax dollars go. He said he feels there should be a higher sales tax so that everyone would pay, not just the property owners for the schools. Stromman said they need to dismantle the overreach from the deregulating. The Board thanked Stromman for coming to the meeting.

Jon Cannon, NACO Executive Director, met with the Board. He thanked Milo Cardenas, County Sheriff, for testifying at the legislature. Cannon said he was an employee of the 93 counties and that he works for us. He talked about what MIPS does for the county. He said there are resources available for counties including grants, etc. He said the Ogallala site will have their grand opening on October 10^{th} and Legislative Conference will be there on October 11, 2024. He said they have asked Peggy Brass to move there and be available for the facility. She has agreed to this. Cannon talked about Inheritance Tax that counties use for things beyond the levy. The special session that Governor Pillen called was discussed.

Motion was made by Schmidt, seconded by Batterman, to go into Executive Session, according to Ne. Statute #84-1410 (d), to prevent needless injury to an individual at 9:20 A.M. Yeas: Schmidt, Batterman and Metz. Nays: None. Motion carried. Milo Cardenas, County Sheriff was asked to stay. Motion was made by Batterman, seconded by Schmidt, to return to regular session at 11:10 A.M., with no action taken. Yeas: Batterman, Schmidt and Metz. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The Board reported on meetings they had attended. Schmidt said he had no meetings and the ones he has this week, he will have to miss if any of the other commissioners want to go they can.. Batterman said she had the RIBAHAC meeting that Region I talked about earlier. Metz said he had a CAPWN meeting and the meeting with Sitchie was delayed until this week. Milo Cardenas said they had that regional meeting about the jail and nothing was done and they will be having another meeting later.

Ashley Fenning, Extension Educator, said she would be interested in being involved with Region I Behavioral Health. Batterman said she would talk to them about that at the board meeting.

There being no further discussion, Chairperson Metz adjourned the meeting at 11:15 A.M. Next meeting will be Tuesday, September 24, 2024.
