
YPD does for every major holiday that centers around Jesus Christ is hold events to help children and young adults understand how they should honor Him at young ages.

The St. Paul AME Church Choir Participated in the City of Raleigh Museum's 160 Years Emancipation Day Celebration

On January 1, 1892, formally enslaved people of Wake County gathered to celebrate their 29th anniversary of emancipation. Prayer for that special occasion was provided by St. Paul's pastor, Rev. J. W. Telfair.

This year, on January 7, 2023, St. Paul's choir continued the tradition of participating in an emancipation celebration as they rendered music at a 160-

year Emancipation Day Celebration held at the City of Raleigh Museum. The choir sang "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" and "Lord Help Me to Hold Out."

The program also included a narrator and orators who spoke about the history of slavery, emancipation, politics, and the progression of formerly enslaved people. The program's narrator also provided information about the 1865 and 1866 Freedmen's Conventions which were

held at historic St. Paul AME Church. The program set a precedent for the City of Raleigh Museum's Emancipation Day Celebrations in future years.









Thessalonica

Sesame Ginger Dressing – an immunity booster! – Courtesy EverydayHealth.com

- 1/2 cup + 2 tablespoons water
- 5 Tablespoons tahini
- 4 Tablespoons lemon juice
- 1/2 Tablespoon minced fresh ginger
- 1 teaspoon honey
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- Sea salt and pepper, to taste (about 1/2 teaspoon each
- 1. In food processor or blender, puree dressing ingredients until smooth.
- 2. Note: Add more or less water to get desired consistency.
- 3. Store dressing in refrigerator for up to 7 days.
- 4. Use this dressing over rice and veggies, salmon, chicken, or beef.

Nat'l. Financial Capability Month provides a great "excuse" to have *the other* "Talk" with teens about financial preparedness & debt.


By high school and college young adults are bombarded by credit card offers, buy-now-pay-later plans, and personal loan advertising!
