In today's Gospel, Jesus exhorts us about the danger of relying solely on material goods, especially to the point of allowing such 'wealth' to control our existence, resulting in greed and possessiveness. Such stored up treasures will not last. Instead, Jesus invites us to reflect on the true riches of



human life. He reminds us that such wealth lies in being rich in matters pertaining to God. This week, let us take time to examine our lives to see where our treasure lies – in material goods that will not last or in God who fills us with wealth of the 'richest kind', a wealth that will last forever.



FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD - August 6: This Feast has been observed on this day by the universal Church since the 15th century. Today we are encouraged to pray and reflect on the biblical account of the Transfiguration (*Mark 9.2-10*).

The account of the Transfiguration is an awe-inspiring indication of the resplendent glory that belongs to Jesus as God's unique Son. However, following his transfiguration, Jesus moves steadily toward his death. Thus, we must not lose sight of the broader message: Whoever follows Jesus must be willing to do what he did and so renounce glory in exchange for suffering.

AUGUST 4 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT JEAN-MARIE VIANNEY, PRIEST: John, ordained in 1815, is known by a more familiar title, Curé d'Ars. He became the parish priest of a French village where most of the people were not interested in religion or God. His devotion to prayer and fasting obtained unimaginable results and he became renowned as a confessor, hearing confessions for 12 to 16 hours a day. He died in 1859, was canonized in 1925, and is a patron of parish priests.

AUGUST 5 - MEMORIAL OF THE DEDICATION OF THE BASILICA OF SAINT MARY MAJOR: This basilica, built in the 4th century under Pope Liberius, was first called the Liberian Basilica. However, after the Council of Ephesus (431) proclaimed Mary the Mother of God, the Church was repaired and reconsecrated about the year 435 as the Basilica of the Virgin Mary. It is called Saint Mary Major (Great Saint Mary's) because it is older and larger than other Roman Churches also dedicated to Our Lady.

AUGUST 8 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT DOMINIC. PRIEST: Dominic founded the Order of Preachers (Dominicans) in 1216. Priests of this Order were highly educated and could be sent where the need was greatest, fighting heresy and preaching the importance of the Sacraments. Dominic died in 1221. was canonized in 1234, and is a patron saint of the Dominican Republic (named after the Latin word for Sunday), astronomers, scientists, and falsely accused persons.

AUGUST 9 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS, VIRGIN AND MARTYR: In 1891, Edith Stein was born into a large Jewish family in Breslau, Germany (present-day Poland). A remarkable student, she received her doctorate at age 25. She was drawn to Catholicism and was baptized in 1922, spending the next 12 years teaching at Catholic institutions. Although she was a convert to Catholicism, Edith always acknowledged her Jewish heritage and saw the Cross as her destiny. In 1934 she joined the Carmelites in Cologne, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. However, by 1938, Nazi antisemitism was widespread, and in 1942 Edith was arrested by the Gestapo and deported to Auschwitz where she died in a gas chamber. She was canonized in 1998 and is co-patron of Europe.
