#### Clinic Column

This month since we have no meetings, and I don't have any clinician info, I thought I'd present a "mini clinic."

The title is "How I make my own shrubs or weeds with static grass." The numbered photographs are at the end of this clinic column.

This may not be a new idea, in fact I modified it from a video I saw on YouTube.

On that video the modeler used part of this technique with his static grass applicator. Since I didn't want to drag out my applicator, I thought I'd modify the technique a bit.

I used a piece of Parchment Paper (1) taped to a table. For my glue I used Matte Medium (2). Matte Medium remains flexible after drying. In my case I used 4mm static grass (3).

I applied a stream of Matte Medium and spread it out to a desired shape. I used a stick to spread it out (4).

I then poured some static grass over the Matte Medium. Pour enough so that you have a pile over the medium. You'll be able to recover the excess later. Then tamp the grass down. I used a paint brush (5).

Let it sit for 24 hours.

Once dry, you can peel off the grass patch. Shake off the excess grass and save for re-use (6).

You can use the remaining patch as is by gluing onto your layout, or you can cut to shape. I cut a straight line on one patch to use tight to a building base (7).

The advantage to creating this grass patch "off-layout" is that it's easier to recover the excess grass for re-use...and it keeps any errant Matte Medium from a building base.

I have also used "dry brushing" on some patches to vary the color and add some small "blooms."
















# SCWD 2025 Annual Summer Picnic Saturday, July 12, 2025



For the past several years, except for 2020, the SCWD has held a catered picnic at Little Amerricka Park in Marshall. The SCWD Board has agreed to do so, again, this summer on Saturday, July 12. Reservations have been made with the amusement park for use of their Blue Rose Pavilion and catering is being provided by Angelo's, used in 2024. The park opens at noon and closes at 5 pm. Lunch will be served starting at 12:30 pm. As was done in 2019, 2022, 2023, and 2024 the Board has decided to defray part of the catering cost by charging a \$5.00 fee for each attendee, six years old and above. Five and under get the meal for free. Railway equipment can be viewed for free, but train and other rides require purchased tickets from the Park. SCWD members and their families, Youth Club members and their families and other invited guests, approved by the Board, can attend the picnic. To determine the food quantities for the caterer, you will have to sign up and pay by July 1, 2025. Please indicate ages for kids under 12 to help in planning for quantities for kid's meals. Little Amerricka is located on STH 19 on the east edge of Marshall. Parking directly at the Blue Rose Pavilion can be reached off Box Elder Rd. intersecting USH 19 just east of the Park's regular entrance.

<u>Added Attraction</u> Roy Grant will have his N-scale, Omaha Western layout open from 10 am to noon on July 12th. The layout in his house was on display prior to the 2017 picnic. He has now rebuilt the layout into a separate building. His property is about 2 miles west from the first intersection north of I-94 on STH 73 at West Medina Rd. The address is 1465 West Medina Rd., Deerfield, WI 53531.

#### The Pacific and Eastern Railway A Gem Tucked Away in Greencastle Indiana

There are so many great and interesting things going on in the Midwest Region; that unfortunately you are just never going to know or hear about.

The following was submitted by Superintendent Art Dawson for publication in the Bad Order

Our Region covers Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana and western Kentucky. That is a fair amount of real estate, and a bunch of ground to cover!

This story actually started at my church many years ago when I met Rod Weinschenk at St. Stephens' Lutheran Church in Plainfield, Indiana. We saw each other on a fairly regular basis, and neither of us ever happened on the subject of model railroading.

One day, many years ago, I was sitting in the Narthex and gazing at my model railroading magazine. By chance, Rod saw me and the rest is history. Rod told me that he had N scale trains and explained how he painted and detailed N scale figures. How do you see them? That was my question.

I invited Rod over to Connie Coy's and my O Scale Glacier Line layout; which uses 3-rail track in a realistic setting—Marias Pass in the area of Glacier National Park. It wasn't long until Rod became a core member of our Glacier Line Crew operating and even earning the AP Chief Dispatcher certificate! Rod, and his wife Staci, began buying more and more O guage model trains.

Somewhere, somehow, someway, Rod became involved with a modular 3-rail club: The Pacific and Eastern. This group has been around a long while and brings their layout to display at NMRA shows.

This club was very fortunate to have had Rod become involved as there were issues that needed to be addressed and it seemed like fate sent Rod to this club.

Rod became this club's President and he even managed to get the Club a space to set-up the layout in the Putnam County Museum. The museum is located on the north edge of Greencastle 1105 N. Jackson Street, Greencastle.

I was inspired to write this to make more people aware that a good-sized model railroad club is based in Greencastle, Indiana. You just never know.

Greencastle's in Putnam County, Indiana. In mid-May 2025, approximately 90 South Putnam Elementary 2nd graders, adult escorts, and teachers toured the museum. Rod provided them some education and entertainment with an operating session of sorts.

Quote of the day! It came from one of the kids: "This is the greatest day of my life, these trains!"

Truly, it is a great day when the National Model Railroad Association can "bring" model railroading to children.

It is a blessing that NMRA Member Rod Weinschenk, who is also the Regional Chairman of the Audit Committee, and also the President of the Pacific and Eastern Railway, managed to get the Putnam County Museum to provide a space for the club.

Greencastle has a long railroad history which is on display and available at the museum.

Countless people, including many children, have been exposed to model railroading due to the tremendous efforts of NMRA Member Rod Weinschenk. He is a great Ambassador for the hobby and NMRA!

The only bad is Rod doesn't get to the Glacier Line nearly as much as he used to. The Crew misses him here, but he has done himself proud and brought the Pacific and Eastern Railway to Greencastle, where many folks have enjoyed it tremendously.

If you are close to Greencastle or will be passing through, look up the Pacific and Eastern Railway club and stop in! Or, look for the club at many NMRA Midwest Region train shows!

This is a very friendly and good group of people! Many of whom are NMRA Members! I wonder if I could convince the club to become an NMRA club? That's a story for another day.

#### A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's



layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?

Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

Beginners can start with 3 introductory puzzles to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.




## **OPS Puzzles**




